labored Boats Whale to the Ship, at 6 Am. Commenced cutting as ends the Day with light winds from the Eastward and fine weather.

Monday Nov. 2nd. at 3 P.M. finished cutting and commenced boiling, with light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, steering on Different tacks by the wind so ends boiling the whale the middle of Backanura bearing S. by E. -
Lat 16° 18' S.

Tuesday Nov. 3rd. This Day winds from the Eastward and fine weather, steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 3 Am. finished boiling the remainder of the Day employed in mending the hole and mending Decks, &c.

Lat 16° 08' S. the middle of the Island bearing S. by E.
Wednesday Nov. 4th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, steering on Different tacks by the wind variously employed -
Lat 16° 34' S. the middle of Backanura bearing S. E.

Thursday Nov. 5th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, steering on Different tacks by the wind, so ends the middle of the Island -
S. E. 12 miles Distance.

Friday Nov. 6th. At 1 P.M. Saw Sperm Whales, and lowered the Waist Boat, fastened, and the line bit off. at 2 Do. the Starboard Waist and Bow Boats, fastened, at 6 Do. took three Whales to the Ship. Three miles from the Reef, Carried all Bait through the night at half past 2 Am. commenced cutting at 9 Do. finished, the remainder of the Day employed in clearing away the heads, and clearing Decks, so ends with light winds from the S. W. steering to the S. W. by the wind the middle of the Island bearing S. E. 20 -
m. 1/2 S.

Saturday Nov. 7th. At half past midnight commenced boiling our watch below, at Midnight wore of ship, at 6 Am. finished boiling, latter part rainy and thick weather, no land in sight so ends these 24 hours.

Sunday Nov. 8th. Commenced with light winds and variables attended with rain, middle part the same, latter part fine weather so ends all Bait set.
Lat 15° 30' S. Backanura in Sight.

Monday Nov. 9th. Commenced with light winds from the Northward and fine weather, middle and latter part rainy and thick weather so ends these 24 hours steering on Different tacks by the wind.

Tuesday Nov. 10th. Breeze middle part thick weather and squally appearance, latter part fine weather, with a fine breeze from the S. W. steering to the E. by S. so ends, employed in breaking out the after hole and mending the divisions between Decks.
Lat 15° 22' S. Barwell Island bearing S. E. by E.

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Wednesday Nov. 11th. This Day light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, steering to the E. by S. all Bait set, latter part employed in slowing down oil so ends these 24 hours.
Lat 15° 00' S.

Thursday Nov. 12th. Commenced with light winds from the westward steering to the E. by S. latter part winds from the S. E. steering to the E. N. E. by the wind. Employed in slowing down oil, so ends these 24 hours.
Lat 15° 14' S.

Friday Nov. 13th. All these 24 hours fine weather with winds from E. by S. to S. E. steering to the North Eastward by the wind, with all Bait set, variously employed.
Lat 14° 55' S.

Saturday Nov. 14th. Commenced with light winds from the S. E. steering on to the Eastward by the wind, middle part variables winds and squally attended with rain, steering on Different tacks, at 9 Am. cleared of, so ends Calm.
Lat 14° 36' W. S.

Sunday Nov. 15th. This Day winds from the E. steering to the Southward by the wind, at 6 Am. made Onockfow bearing S. E. by S. at meridian the Island bore E. S. E. so ends these 24 hours all Bait set and fine weather.
Lat 15° 48' S.

Monday Nov. 16th. This Day light winds from the Eastward, steering on Different tacks by the wind, so ends variously employed, Onockfow in sight.
Lat 15° 54' S.

Tuesday Nov. 17th. This Day light winds from the Eastward and equally steering on Different tacks by the wind, at Meridian the middle of Onockfow bearing S. by E. 25 m. S. E. 25 m. S. E.

Wednesday Nov. 18th. Commenced with light winds from the Eastward, steering on Different tacks by the wind, middle and latter part equally attended with heavy showers rain, took in and made Bait a number of times.

Thursday Nov. 19th. Commenced with strong winds from the Eastward, steering on Different tacks by the wind, at Sunset took the Pop-Sails at 10 P.M. took in the Mizzen Pop-Sail and Fore Sail at 11 Am took in the Fore Pop-Sail so ends the Day with a strong Gale, and rainy thick weather.

Friday Nov. 20th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward and equally attended with rain, at 7 Am. set the Bow and Mizzen Pop-Sails Double reefed, at 10 Do. let the reefs out, so ends steering on different tacks by the wind, mending halyards.

Saturday Nov. 21st. This Day winds from the Eastward, at 6 P.M. carried away the tiller, latter part employed in making another look in and made Bait a number of times, steering to the S. E. by the wind, so ends under a Double
