Reefed Main Top-Sail Bore Sail and Spencers with a strong Gale from the Eastward
 Lat 18° 41' N. Long 175° 09' W.

Sunday Nov. 22nd. All these 24 hours a strong Gale from the Eastward heading on different tacks by the wind under a close reefed Main Top-Sail Bore Sail, and Spencers so ends employed making the Tiller.

Monday Nov. 23rd. All this Day strong Gale from the E. and thick weather attended with showers of rain, heading on different tacks under short Sail.

Tuesday Nov. 24th. All this Day lying to under a close reefed Main Top-Sail and Spencers, heading on different tacks with a strong Gale from the Eastward and thick weather attended with rain so ends.

Wednesday Nov. 25th. All this Day lying under short Sail, with our Boats turned up, with a heavy Gale from the Eastward, first and middle part rainy
 Lat 18° 18' N. Long 174° 52' W.

Thursday Nov. 26th. Commences with a strong Gale from the Eastward and thick weather heading to the Southward by the wind, at 1 P.M. reefed the Bore Sail and set it, at 5 P.M. the fog lighted up, made Late bearing S. E. 12 miles Dis. more Ship and set the Bore Top-Sail close reefed, and Steered to the N. E. through the Night, latter part more moderate, made some Sail, Steering on different courses so ends these 24 hours variously employed about the Rigger.

Friday Nov. 27th. Commences with strong winds from the Northward Steering to the S. by E. middle part moderate Steering to the S. by W. all Sail set, with winds from the W. so ends employed in splicing the Topmast backstay &c.
 Lat 19° 54' N. Long 173° 09' W.

Saturday Nov. 28th. This Day winds from the W. Steering to S. W. by the wind, at meridian tacke Ship to the Northward so ends.
 Lat 20° 25' N. Long 173° 34' W.

Sunday Nov. 29th. This Day light winds from the Westward Steering on different tacks by the wind all Sail set.
 Lat 20° 44' N. Long 173° 12' W.

Monday Nov. 30th. Commences with a fine breeze from the Eastward steering to the S. W. by the wind, at 4 P.M. spoke the Barque Montreal of London 22 months out 1200 bbls. and the William West with 1300 bbls. the Capt. went on board the the Montreal, tacke Ship to the Northward, at Sunset shortened Sail, at 10 P.M. more Ship, latter part Steering to the Westward on Sail in Light.

Tuesday Dec. 1st. Commences with winds from the Eastward Steering to the W. by S. at Sunset spoke the Ship Newburyport Capt. Starbuck, of Newburyport.
 Lat 21° 14' N. Long 174° 04' W.

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15 months out 1600 bbls. Coa bearing W. by S. 30 miles Distance Capt. Parker must on board, at 8 P.M. the Capt. returned on board and Steered in for the Lane, at 8 P.M. lowered two boats and went on shore on the West side of the Island in company with Capt. Starbuck so ends the boats on shore a trading with the Natives.

Wednesday Dec. 2nd. At 4 P.M. the boats returned from the Shore loaded with Yams, at 6 P.M. Capt. Starbuck came on board at 7 P.M. left the Ship, Steered to the S. W. by S. through the night under short Sail, at Daylight made all sail and Steered to the S. W. at 9 A.M. made Pylotarts Island, so ends variously employed about the rigging, at meridian the Island bearing S. W. by S. 16 miles Distance.
 Lat 22° 07' N. Long by Chron. 175° 36' W.

Thursday Dec. 3rd. Commences with light winds from the Eastward Steering to the S. W. by W. at Sunset shortened Sail and headed to the Southward by the wind, at Daylight all Sail and steered to the Southward by the wind employed in Sail mending &c. at meridian Pylotarts bearing W. by E. 4 E. by Compass.
 Lat 22° 54' N. Long

Friday Dec. 4th. First and Middle part calm, latter part light winds and variables Steering to the South Eastward, employed in Sail mending so ends the Day.
 Lat 23° 23' N. Long by Chron. 175° 40' W.

Saturday Dec. 5th. This Day light winds and variables at Steering on different courses, at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made all Sail, at 9 P.M. saw a Sail chasing whales and boiling, so ends these 24 hours.

Sunday Dec. 6th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward and squally at 4 P.M. spoke the Barque Aron of London boiling 8 months from Sidney with 1100 bbls. the Capt. went on board at Sunset shortened Sail and headed to the Southward.
 Lat 23° 52' N. Long 175° 24' W.

Monday Dec. 7th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward first part Steering to the S. W. by E. by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail and headed to the Southward by the wind, at Daylight set Double reefed Top-Sails so ends employed in Sail mending.
 Lat by obs 24° 26' N.

Tuesday Dec. 8th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward Steering on different tacks by the wind under short Sail, at 10 A.M. spoke the Barque Rover, Reel, of London 300 bbls. Middle and latter part thick and wet weather so ends.

Wednesday Dec. 9th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward Steering on different tacks by the wind under short Sail, middle and latter part squally attended with light showers of rain so ends.
 Lat 24° 30' N. Long 175° 17' W.
