

Commence boiling, so ends these 24 hours with winds from the S.E. and fine weather
Lat 32° 59' N. - - - - - Long 179° 32' E.

Tuesday Dec 29th. Commences with light winds from the S.E. Steering to the South-
ward by the wind at Sunset shortened Sail, at 4 P.M. finished boiling Middle and latter
part strong winds so ends these 24 hours under a Double reefed M. S. Sail and Bow Sail.

Lat 33° 33' N. - - - - - Long 179° 00' E.

Wednesday Dec 30th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward Steering on Different
tacks by the wind, latter part under a Double reefed Main S. Sail and Bow Sail em-
ployed in Stowing oil down the After hold so ends these 24 hours.

Thursday Dec 31st. This Day strong gale from the Eastward first part employed
in stowing down oil at 7 P.M. took on the Bow Sail and close reefed the Main S. Sail
at 11 P.M. wore Ship to the Southward took in the Bow Boat, a heavy Gale ends the Day
N.B. obs.

Friday Jan. 1st. Commences with a heavy Gale from the N.E. at 7 P.M. began
to moderate at 7 P.M. set the Pop Sails Double reefed Jib and Bow Sail at 10 P.M. let
the reefs out, light winds from the N. and a heavy swell running from the N.E.
ends the Day, Steering to the S.E. by the wind all Sail set.

Lat 34° 15' N. - - - - - Long 178° 13' E.

Saturday Jan. 2nd. This Day winds from the N.E. Steering to Eastward by the wind
at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made all Sail, nothing more to be remarked.

Lat 34° 06' N. - - - - - Long 179° 16' E.

Sunday Jan. 3rd. Commences with with B.ish winds from the N.E. and fine
weather Steering to Eastward by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail, middle
part the same at Daylight set the Pop Sails Jib and Bow Sail, latter part
strong winds and thick weather attended with light Showers of rain so ends
N.B. obs.

Monday Jan. 4th. This Day strong winds from N.E. to W. S.W. and rain, head-
ing to the S.W. Eastward under short Sail, at 8 P.M. took in the Bow
Boat, nothing more to be remarked, so ends

Lat 32° 57' N. - - - - - Long 178° 50' W.

Tuesday Jan 5th. This Day being to under a close reefed Main S. Sail Owners
and Fore Staysail with a heavy Gale from W. S.W. to S. attended with rain
N.B. obs.

Wednesday Jan. 6th. All these 24 hours lying to under a close reefed Main S. Sail and
Owners heading to the Eastward with a heavy Gale from the S. at 10 P.M. began
to moderate so ends. Lat 32° 53' N. - - - - - Long 177° 04' W.

Thursday Jan. 7th. Commences with a strong gale from the W. middle part the
same, at 5 P.M. set the Fore Sail and Pop Sails Double reefed and wore Ship so
ends with light winds and a heavy swell, Lat 33° 04' N. - - - - - Long 177° 39' W.

Friday Jan. 8th. Commences with light winds from the S.E. Steering to the
S.W. by the wind at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Cortes of Rev. Bedford 18 months out
1150 bbls. Capt. Parker went on board at Sunset took in Some Sail, at Daylight made
all Sail and Steered to the W. S.W. so ends these Sail in sight.

Lat 33° 05' N. - - - - - Long

Saturday Jan. 9th. This Day winds from the S.E. at Sunset Shortened Sail
and heaved to the through the night at Daylight made Sail and Steered to the
W. by S. nothing more to be remarked, so ends these 24 hours.

Lat 33° 14' N. - - - - - Long 179° 10' W.

Sunday Jan. 10th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward Steering to
the Southward by the wind at 2 P.M. the Bow Boat fastened and down the iron,
at 3 P.M. the Lubber Boat fastened at 4 P.M. took the Whale to the Ship at 5 P.M. commenced
cutting at 8 P.M. finished at 6 P.M. commenced boiling at 7 P.M. saw several Whales going
quick to the windward, saw no more of them, so ends boiling under Double reef
heading to the Southward with a strong Gale from the E.

Lat 33° 09' N. - - - - - Long 179° 29' W.

Monday Jan. 11th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward, at Mid-
night finished boiling, latter part a brig in sight to windward, so ends Steering
on Different tacks by the wind under Double reef Pop Sails

Lat 32° 51' N. - - - - - Long 179° 31' W.

Tuesday Jan. 12th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward at Sunset shortened
Sail at Daylight set the Pop Sails Double reefed so ends, Steering on Different tacks.

Lat 33° 12' N. - - - - - Long 179° 49' W.

Wednesday Jan 13th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward
Steering to the N. by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail at Daylight made
some Sail and wore Ship the remainder of the Day employed in stowing down oil
in the after hold so ends with light winds and fine weather.

Lat 32° 42' N. - - - - - Long 179° 33' W.

Thursday Jan 14th. This Day winds from the Eastward and fine weather Steering
on Different tacks by the wind at 2 P.M. spoke the Barque Walstead of London
26 months out 1000 bbls. at 4 P.M. finished stowing down, at Sunset shortened Sail
at Daylight made all Sail latter part employed in breaking out and stowing between
Decks so ends these 24 hours.

Lat 33° 07' N. - - - - - Long 179° 36' W.

Friday Jan. 15th. This Day winds from the Eastward and fine weather Steering on
Different tacks by the wind, under short Sail through the night at 6 P.M. saw a
Barque to windward cutting, nothing more to be remarked, so ends

Lat 34° 01' N. - - - - - Long 179° 40' W.

Saturday Jan 16th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather
at 2 P.M. took Ship to the N. by the wind, carried easy Sail through the night, latter
part all Sail set so ends Lat 33° 10' N. - - - - - Long 179° 53' W.
