Sunday Jan. 18th. This Day light winds from the Eastward and fine weather steering to the Northward by the wind, lying under short Sail through the night, at 7 A.M. spoke the Ship *Leam* of Edgerton, Capt. Luce 11 months out 400 bls. so ends three Sail in sight

Latt 32° 24' S. - - - Long 179° 12' W.

Monday Jan. 19th. Commences with strong winds from the E. C. steering to the N.E. at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship *Milo* of J. Per. Bedford Capt. Worth 11 months out 750 bls. at Sunset shortened Sail at Daylight made Sail and steered to the N.E. by W. at 9 P.M. made the French rock bearing N.W. by W. at Meridian the rock bore E.N.E. 1/2 mi. Distance so ends a number of Sail in sight.

Latt by obs. 31° 26' S. - - - Long by Chron. 178° 23' W.

Tuesday Jan. 19th. This Day winds from the Eastward, steering in different courses at 7 P.M. spoke the *Barque Victoria* of Widney neil, lying under short Sail through the night, at Daylight made all Sail at 10 A.M. saw rocks under the Ship supposed to be 5 fathoms of water *Macaulay's Rocks* bearing N.W. by W. 1/2 miles Distance, tacked Ship to the Southward at Meridian the rocks bore N.W. by W. 1/2 mi. Dis.

Latt 30° 43' S. - - - Long at 10 A.M. 178° 42' W.

Wednesday Jan. 20th. Commences with winds from the Eastward steering to the Southward by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail, 4 Sail in sight, at Daylight made Sail and steered to the Northward by the wind at 11 A.M. steered to the N.W. so ends employed in Sail mending, at Meridian goat Island bearing N.N.E. 10 miles Distance

Latt by obs. 30° 24' S. - - - Long 178° 42' W.

Thursday Jan. 21st. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the N.W. at Sunset took in all Sail except the Main Top-Sail Double reefed and the Spruce, at 11 P.M. came to head to the N.W. at Daylight made Sail and steered to the W.N.W. nothing more to be remarked

Latt 29° 16' S. - - - Long 179° 47' W.

Friday Jan. 22nd. This Day strong winds from the Eastward steering on different tracks by the wind, lying under close reefed Main Top-Sail through the night the remainder of the Day under Double reef, so ends employed in Sail mending.

Latt 29° 03' S. - - - Long 179° 39' W.

Saturday Jan. 23rd. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the Southward by the wind, under Double reef, at sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight set the Top-Sails Double reefed at 7 A.M. wore Ship, strong winds into the Day, employed Sail mending.

Latt 29° 37' S. - - - Long 179° 40' E.

Sunday Jan. 24th. This Day strong winds from the Eastward steering to the Northward by the wind under Double reef, lying under a close reefed Main Top-Sail through the night, at Meridian Latt 28° 40' S. - Long 179° 59' E.

Monday Jan. 25th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the N.W. by the wind under Double reef, at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made Sail, so ends steering to Northward under Double reef.

Latt 28° 00' S. - - - Long 179° 34' W.

Tuesday Jan. 26th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the N.W. by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail, middle and latter part more moderate, so ends all sail set variously employed about the rigging.

Latt 27° 13' S. - - - Long 178° 39' W.

Wednesday Jan. 27th. This Day brisk winds from the E.S.E. steering to northward by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made all Sail, latter part employed in breaking out of water and making running rope.

Latt 26° 11' S. - - - Long 178° 42' W.

Thursday Jan. 28th. This Day winds from the E.S.E. steering to the N.W. by the wind, at 2 P.M. saw a Sail to windward, heading to the Northward, at Sunset shortened Sail, latter part saw Blackfish, so ends variously employed about the rigging.

Latt 25° 00' S. - - - Long 177° 23' W.

Friday Jan. 29th. This Day winds from the E.S.E. steering to the N.W. by the wind, at Sunset took in the Main top gallant sail, Main sail, and Single reefed the Fore and Mizen Top-Sails, latter part all Sail set so ends.

Latt 23° 57' S. - - - Long 176° 05' W.

Saturday Jan. 30th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward and fine weather steering to the N.W. by the wind, the watch employed

Latt 23° 10' S. - - - Long 175° 20' W.

Sunday Jan. 31st. All this Day winds from the Eastward and fine weather, at 5 P.M. tacked Ship to the Southward, at Sunset took in the Main Top Gallant sail and Main sail, and Double reefed the Top-Sails, at Daylight wore Ship and made all Sail, so ends nothing more to be remarked.

Latt 22° 54' S. - - - Long 175° 07' W.

Monday Feb. 1st. This Day light winds from the Eastward and fine weather at 2 P.M. tacked Ship to the Southward, at Sunset took in some Sail at Daylight made all Sail, so ends variously employed about the rigging, a Sail in sight.

Latt 24° 00' S. - - - Long 175° 04' W.

Tuesday Feb. 2nd. First and Middle part light winds from the Eastward steering to the Southward by the wind, latter part strong winds and thick weather steering to the northward under Double reef so ends.

N.B. obs.

Wednesday Feb. 3rd. Commences with a strong Gale from the E.S.E. steering to the N.E. by the wind at 1 P.M. took in the Fore and Mizen Top-Sails, at 4 P.M. took in the Bow Boat, and turned up the Waist Boat, at 6 P.M. took in the Main Top-Sail, Middle and latter part the same, so ends.

Latt by obs. 23° 37' S. - - - Long 173° 53' W.
