tacks by the wind under Double reef, latter part more moderate
so ends with all Sail set Steering to the E.S.E. by the wind.

Sunday May 22nd. at 1 P.M. run over the Whales with Ship and lowered
four Boats at 5 Do. returned to the Ship without success Shortened Sail and
stood on Different Different tacks through the night, at Day light made
all Sail at 8 A.M. saw Spinn Whales and lowered at 10 Do. the Waist fastened at
11 Do. took the whale to the Ship, at meridian give up the chase and returned
to the Ship, so ends with strong winds from the N.W. and squally.

Monday May 23rd. at 1 P.M. commenced cutting, at half past 2 Do. finished
at 3 Do. saw Spinn whales, at 4 Do. lowered the Labourer Waist and four Boats
at 5 Do. the Boats fastened, at 6 Do. took 3 Whales to the Ship, one from each
Boat, at 6 A.M. commenced cutting at 9 Do. finished and commu-
enced boiling, made all Sail and Steered to the N.P.E. with winds
from the N.W. so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday May 24th. All this Day light winds from the E. Steering to the
Eastward by the wind, at Meridian finished boiling the whales.

weather Steering on Different tacks by the wind, variously employed.

Thursday May 26th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward
Steering to the Southward by the wind, at 6 A.M. made Packanura
leaving S.E. - at Meridian Cheek leaving S.E. by E. - Lat. 16° 11' N.

Friday May 27th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward
Steering on Different tacks by the wind, trying easy Sail through
the night, at half past 11 A.M. a number of Canoes came along side

of the Ship with a few Yams and Coconuts, to trade, so ends trading
with the Natives of Packanura, 2 miles Distance from the reef.

Saturday May 28th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward
at 1 P.M. the Canoes all left the Ship at 4 P.M. took in the Top - Gallant
Sails and flying Jib, at almost took in the Fore and Mizen Top - Sails and
Double reefed the main, at 7 P.M. unhooked the Main Top - Sail and bent
another, and set it close reefed, so ends under a close reefed Main Top - Sail
and Fore - Sail with strong Breezes from the S.E. Steering on Different
tacks Packanura in sight.

Sunday May 29th. All these 24 hours a strong Gale from the
S.E. Steering on Different tacks under a close reefed Main Top -
Sail Fore - Sail, Main Spencer Gc. so ends Packanura in sight

Lat. 15° 47' N. Okeah Island leaving E. by S.

Monday May 30th. All these 24 hours a strong Gale from the S.E. Steer-
ing on Different tacks, under a close reefed Main Top - Sail and Fore - Sail,
latter part employed in repairing the Main Top - Sail, so ends Packanura
in sight. N.B. obs.

Tuesday May 31st. All these 24 hours strong Gales from the S.E. Steer-
ing on Different tacks under a close reefed Main Top - Sail and Fore -
Sail Middle part rainy, latter part thick weather so ends employed
in Sail mending.

Wednesday June 1st. Commences with a strong winds from the
E. by S. heading to the N.W. and by the wind under a close reefed
Main Top - Sail and Fore - Sail, Middle and latter part rainy, attended

reefed, so ends Steering on Different tacks by the wind.
