

Ship, middle part Calm, latter part light winds from the Eastward
Steering to the Northward by the wind all Sail set in company with the
Rafael so ends these 24 hours Coconut Island bearing E. S. E. 20 miles.

Thursday August 4th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward
Steering to the Northward by the wind in company with the Rafael
Latter part employed in breaking out the Fore hobs, so ends Coconut
Island and a number of other Islands in sight.

Friday August 5th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward
Steering to the Eastward by the wind, at 1 P.M. saw sprits Commence
stowing down oil at 4 P.M. saw sprits, and lowered 4 boats, which proved
to be Killers, at 5 P.M. returned to the Ship, at Sunset Shortened Sail
at Daylight wore Ship, latter part Strong winds, under Double reefed
Fore sails, and Fore Sail, employed in taking shooks from the lower
hole and stowing them between Decks, so ends these 24 hours.

Lat. 16° 35' S. Land in sight.

Saturday August 6th. Commences with Strong winds from the Eastward
Steering to the Southward by the wind, at 5 P.M. finished stowing down oil
at 8 P.M. wore Ship, at 1 P.M. wore Ship, set the jib, and let one reef out of
the Fore Sails, latter part more moderate winds Land in sight.

Sunday August 7th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward and
fine weather Steering on Different tacks by the wind latter part in com-
pany with the Rafael Coconut Island and a number of other Islands
in sight.

to the Northward by the wind, at 5 P.M. Capt. Parker went aboard
the Rafael, at 8 P.M. returned to the Ship, nothing more to be remarked
so ends variously employed.

Tuesday August 9th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward Steering
to the on Different tacks by the wind so ends round Island in sight,

Wednesday August 10th. Commences with light winds from the East-
ward Steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 6 P.M. spoke the
Ship Rafael of St. Vincent, 23 months out 1000 lbs. Middle part
calm, latter part brisk winds from the E. S. E. Steering on Different
Courses so ends Coconut Island bearing E. by S. 14 mi. Dis.

Thursday August 11th. Commences with Brisk winds from the

E. S. E. Steering to the S. in company with the Rafael, and Rafael,
at 2 P.M. hove aback the head yards of Coconut Island, one half mile
Distance from the reef, lowered the Waist Boat and boarded two
Canoes, got a few Yams, and Coconuts, at 5 P.M. Capt. P. went onboard the
Rafael, and M. E. Stutson went onboard the Rafael, at Sunset shortened
Sail, at 10 P.M. returned to the Ship, latter part Steering on Different tacks by
the wind, so ends in company with the Rafael, and Rafael, Land in sight.

Friday August 12th. First part light winds from the E. S. E. Steering
to the Northward by the wind, Middle part light winds from the Southward
and Calm, attended with showers of rain, latter part Brisk Breezes from
the S. E. Steering to the Eastward by the wind, so ends Land in sight.

Saturday August 13th. Commences with winds from the S. Steering Steering
to the E. S. E. at 3 P.M. Steered to the S. E. at 5 P.M. saw a Humpback, at Sunset
shortened Sail and headed to the Westward, at 2 P.M. wore Ship at Daylight
set the Fore Sail, at 10 P.M. Steered to the E. S. E. at 11 P.M. sounded in 19 fathoms
Round Island bearing E. by E. 1/2 E. 15 miles Distance, Steered to the S. E.
remainder of the Day under Double reef so ends with Strong winds.

Sunday August 14th. First part Strong winds from the S. Steering on
Different Courses to the Northward, under Double reef, at Sunset took
in the jib, and Fore Sail, heading on Different tacks through the night
with winds from the S. E. at Daylight made Sail and Steered to the South-
ward by the wind, Packmanua and Round Island in sight, so ends the Day.

Monday August 15th. First part Strong winds from the E. S. E. Steering
to the Southward by the wind, at Sunset wore Ship took in the Fore
and Mizzen Fore Sails, and Double reefed the Main, at Daylight set the
Fore Sails Double reef, and wore Ship, at 10 P.M. Round Island bore
S. by E. 23 miles Distance, so ends employed in Sail mending.

Tuesday August 16th. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the E. S. E. Steering
on Different tacks by the wind, under Double reef, variously employed.

Wednesday August 17th. First part Steering to the S. E. under Double
reefs, with Strong Gale from the E. S. E. at Sunset took in the Fore and
Mizzen Fore Sails, and Close reefed the Main, and wore Ship, at Daylight
set the Fore Sail, so ends with a Strong Gale and squally, attended with
light Showers of rain.
