

Yams, and Cocoanuts, at 4 Do. Discharged the Boats, took them up and Steered to the S. E. Middle and latter part Steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 10 Am. C. Island bore S. by E. 5 mi. Dis.

Lat. 14° 00' S. - - - - - Long. 177° 03' E.

Saturday Sept. 3rd. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward fine weather Steering on Different tacks by the wind so ends a number of Islands in sight.

Lat. 16° 51' S. - - - - - Long. -

Sunday Sept. 4th. Commences with light winds from the E. S. E. Steering to the Southward by the wind, Middle part calm Lat. ten past winds from the S. E. so ends Round Island bearing S. E. by S. 1/4 E. whose Lat. is 16° 44' S. - and Long. 178° 01' E.

Lat. by obs. 16° 21' S. - - - - - Long. 177° 47' E.

Monday Sept. 5th. All these 24 hours Winds from the E. S. E. Steering to the S. E. by the wind, at 10 Am. saw sperm Whales at 11 Do. lowered four Boats, at half past 11 Do. the Waist Boat fastened at Mid. on the Bow Boat fastening, so ends these 24 hours

Lat. - - - - - Long.

Tuesday Sept. 6th. At 1 P.M. the Capt. got his Boat stove and went to the Ship, at 2 P.M. took the Bow Boat whale to the Ship, at 3 Do. commenced cutting, three Boats off towing the whale, at 5 Do. took the Waist Boats whale to the Ship, at 10 Do. finished cutting one whale at 8 Do. commenced cutting so ends these 24 hours.

Wednesday Sept. 7th. At 1 P.M. finished cutting and commenced boiling, the remainder of the Day Steering on Different tacks under easy Sail, with winds from the Eastward and fine weather so ends boiling.

Lat. 15° 38' S. - - - - - Long. 177° 57' E.

Thursday Sept. 8th. This Day winds from the Eastward and fine weather Steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 7 Am. finished boiling the remainder of the Day employed in wetting hole, washing Dishes &c.

Lat. 15° 41' S. - - - - - Long. 178° 00' E.

Friday Sept. 9th. This Day light winds from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind, latter part employed in breaking out the fore peak and stowing the shooks between Decks so ends the south side of Backmanua in sight.

Lat. 16° 15' S. - - - - - Long. 178° 26' E.

Saturday Sept. 10th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, Steering on Different tacks by the wind, employed in stowing down oil, so ends - Lat. 15° 04' S.

Sunday Sept. 11th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward Steering to the Southward by the wind, at 4 P.M. finished stowing down oil, Middle and latter part Steering on Different tacks, Backmanua & Okeah in sight.

Lat. 15° 44' S. - - - - - Long.

Monday Sept. 12th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, Steering on Different tacks by the wind, so ends

Lat. 15° 45' S. - - - - - Okeah bearing S. S. E.

Tuesday Sept. 13th. All these 24 light winds and Calms, Steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 8 Am. the saw sperm Whales and lowered four Boats, at 10 Do. the Waist fastened at half past 10 Do. the Labour and Bow Boats fastened, the Waist Boat engaged a large Whale, which arrived of the Day, so ends at Midian 4 Whales in tow, one to Labour Boat, one to the Waist Boat, and two to the Bow Boat, Okeah bearing E. 30 mi. Dis.

Wednesday Sept. 14th. First part Calm, at 5 P.M. got the Whales to the Ship and commenced cutting at 7 finished cutting one Whale and set the Boats Crew watches, at half past 5 Am. commenced cutting, at 9 Do. finished, the remainder of the Day employed in clearing away the heads, so ends Steering to the Southward by the wind Okeah in sight bearing E.

Thursday Sept. 15th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather, Steering on Different tacks by the wind, employed in boiling. Lat. by obs. 15° 50' S. land in sight so ends

Friday Sept. 16th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward Steering to on Different tacks by the wind, at 10 P.M. finished boiling, latter part variously employed, so ends.

Saturday Sept. 17th. All these 24 hours fresh breezes from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind, a Sail in sight to seaward, so ends at Midian Okeah bearing S. by W. 30 mi. Dis.

Sunday Sept. 18th. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward, Steering on Different tacks by the wind carrying easy Sail through the night at 5 P.M. saw a Ship to seaward cutting, nothing more to be remarked so ends Okeah bearing S. by E. 6 miles Distance

Monday Sept. 19th. Commences with winds from the Eastward and fine weather, Middle and latter part squally attended with rain, so ends under Double reef,
