

Thursday Nov. 10th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward Steering of and on Rotumah, at 1 P.M. the Boats returned with the raft of water, hoisted it in and stored it between Decks at 8 P.M. one watch went on shore on liberty, nothing more to be remarked so ends.

Friday Nov. 11th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind, employed in getting off wood and recruiting the ship, so ends.

Saturday Nov. 12th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind off Rotumah, at 4 P.M. finished getting off wood, at 8 P.M. the starboard watch went on shore on liberty, so ends.

Sunday Nov. 13th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 8 P.M. the starboard watch returned and the laboard watch went on shore on liberty, so ends nothing more to be remarked.

Monday Nov. 14th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward and Equally Steering on Different tacks, of the North of Rotumah, at 11 P.M. the watch returned, one man deserted, so ends variously employed.

Tuesday Nov. 15th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward and Equally, attended with showers of rain, at 3 P.M. the Capt. went on shore, at 6 P.M. returned to the ship, nothing more to be remarked, so ends Rotumah bearing S. 12 miles distance.

Wednesday Nov. 16th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward and Equally attended with heavy showers of rain Steering on Different tacks by the wind, so ends Rotumah bearing S. E. 10 miles distance.

Thursday Nov. 17th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward and Equally attended with showers of rain, Middle part the same, latter part fine weather, at 10 P.M. the Capt. went on shore to Rotumah, at Meridian returned with a female passenger for Bahita so ends variously employed.

Friday Nov. 18th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward, Steering on Different tacks by the wind, at 10 P.M. split the fore top-sail without it and burst another, so ends employed in sail mending.

Saturday Nov. 19th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward Steering to the Southward by the wind, Equally, and thick weather ends the Day employed mending Boats.

Sunday Nov. 20th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward and thick weather Steering to the Southward by the wind,

Lat. 15° 25' N. - Long. 176° 38' E.

Monday Nov. 21st. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward Steering to the Southward by the wind under Double reefs, at 6 P.M. made the Fee-fee Island so ends employed in Boat mending.

Lat. 16° 52' S. - Long. 177° 10' E.

Tuesday Nov. 22nd. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward Steering on Different tacks by the wind under Double reefs, employed in Boat mending so ends a number of Islands in sight.

Wednesday Nov. 23rd. All these 24 hours winds from the Eastward and thick weather attended with showers of rain Steering on Different tacks by the wind, so ends employed in Boat mending, 4 number of Islands in sight, etc., etc.

Thursday Nov. 24th. All these 24 hours strong winds from N. E. and rainy, Steering on Different tacks by the wind under Double reefs top-sails, so ends, 460 land in sight.

Friday Nov. 25th. Commences with strong winds from the N. E. Steering to the Northward by the wind under Double reefs Middle and latter part winds from the N. W. Steering on Different Courses to the Eastward, all sail set, so ends, variously employed.

Lat. 15° 54' S. - Long. 177° 24' E.

Saturday Nov. 26th. First and Middle part winds from the N. W. Steering to the N. E. latter part winds from the W. Steering to the E. fine weather ends the Day all sail set, so ends.
