Friday Jan. 6th At 2 P.M. the Boat returned to the Ship. Load with vegetation, at 3 Do. went onshore again, at 5 Do. returned, at 6 Do. spoke the Louisa of London, 23 months out 1900 bbls. Capt. Parker went on board, at 9 Do. returned Middle and latter part Steering to the S.E. by the wind with light winds from the S.E. so ends still hands variously employed about the riggin mending Boats &c. At Meridian 20° 13' S. in sight bearing S.W.

Saturday Jan. 7th. All these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. and fine weather Steering to the E. at 11 Am. saw a sperm whale, had but one Boat fit to lower, let pass, and did not lower, all hands employed about the riggin and repairing storm Boats so ends the whale in sight off Deck.

Lat. 15° 32' S. Long. 174° 17' W.
Sunday Jan. 8th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward Westward Steering to the E. Middle and latter part light airs from the Southward and Calms, at 11 Am. made Bosconven I. bearing E. by S. by Compass, so ends these 24 hours

Lat. 15° 14' S. Long. 174° 18' W.
Monday Jan. 9th. First and Middle part Calm, latter part light winds from the E. Steering to the Southward by the wind all hands employed about the riggin repairing storm boats &c.

Lat. 15° 30' S. - Bosconven bearing S.E. by E. 1/2 S.
Tuesday Jan. 10th. Commences with light winds from the E. Steering to the Southward by the wind at 3 P.M. got up a Mizzen Popsail, Middle and latter part strong winds so ends all hands employed, some on the riggin, and some repairing Boats.

Lat. 16° 48' S. Long. 174° 13' W.
Wednesday Jan. 11th. Commences with strong winds from the S.E. Steering to the Southward by the wind, at Sunset took in some Sail, at 6 Am. sent up the Mizzen Popsail Yard, at 7 Do. set the Mizzen Pop Sail, and made all the Sail we had to make so ends all hands variously employed.

Lat. 18° 00' S. Long. 174° 40' W.
Thursday Jan. 12th. Commences with brisk winds from the E. Steering to the Southward by the wind, at 2 P.M. made late bearing S.E. by S. at 4 P.M. Double reefed the Popsails, at 5 Do. took in the Jib & Main Sail, Fore and Mizzen Popsails

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and Spanker, and wore Ship, at 6 Am. made Pt. Marguere bearing E. so ends under a Double reefed Main Popsail and Fore Sail with strong winds from the E. the watch employed.

Lat. 17° 40' S. Long. 174° 30' W.
Friday Jan. 13th. First and Middle part strong winds from Eastward Steering to the the Southward by the wind under a Double reefed Main Popsail and Fore Sail, at 7 Am. set the Fore and Mizzen Popsails Double reefed, at 8 Do. set the Mainsail, Jib, and Spanker, so ends these 24 hours variously employed.

Lat. 17° 03' S. Long. 174° 15' West.
Saturday Jan. 14th. First and Middle part strong winds from the S.E. by E. Steering to the S.E. by the wind, at 6 Am. made Bosconven bearing N.W. by E. let the reefs out of the Popsails, so ends, at Meridian 18° 13' S. bearing N.W. by W. - Bosconven bearing S.E. by W. 1/2 W.

Lat. 16° 13' S. Long. 173° 20' W.
Sunday Jan. 15th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the Eastward Steering to the Southward by the wind, nothing more to be remarked.

Lat. Long.
Monday Jan. 16th. Commences with strong winds from the Eastward steering to the Southward by the wind, Middle and latter part light winds and fine weather Steering on different tacks so ends some hands employed on repairing the windluffs, and some on the riggin.

Lat. 14° 44' S. Long. 172° 25' W.
Tuesday Jan. 17th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward Steering on different tacks by the wind, latter part the Navigator in sight, so ends variously employed about the riggin.

Lat. 14° 30' S. Long by Chron. 172° 08' W.
Wednesday Jan. 18th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward, Middle and latter part strong winds and squally atmosphere with rain, Steering on different tacks under Double reefs, so ends.

Lat. S. obs.
Thursday Jan. 19th. Commences with strong Gales from the S.E. by E. and rainy, at 6 P.M. Close reefed the Popsails, and took in the Waist and Staboard Boats, latter part more moderate thick and rainy weather ends the Day all Sail set. Steering to the E. S. obs.

Friday Jan. 20th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the S.E. by E. Steering on different tacks by the wind, variously employed.

Lat. 14° 55' S. Long. 172° 45' W.
Saturday Jan. 21st. At 2 P.M. made Boctoilla, bearing S.W. at Sunset took in the Coups, Jib, and Spanker, at Daylight made all Sail, at 8 Am.
