

Sail, a heavy Gale from the N.E. W. and rainy weather ends the Day -
No. obs.

Sunday Feb. 26th. Commences with Strong Gales from the N.E. W. attended with rain, at 6 P.M. cleared of the rain, and the wind more moderate, at 10 Do. set the P. Sails Double reefed, Bore Sail and Spanker, Middle and latter part Strong winds and equally attended with showers of rain, so ends Steering the N.E. winds W.S.W.

Lat. by obs. 21° 49' S. - Long. by account 142° 12' West -

Monday Feb. 27th. Commences with light winds from the West Steering to the N.E. W. by the wind all Sail set, at 5 P.M. single reefed the Bopsails, and took in the Main Sail, Middle and latter part winds from W. to S.W. by S.E. and equally attended with heavy showers of rain so ends.

Lat. by obs. 20° 51' S. - Long. 146° 44' W.

Tuesday Feb. 28th. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the W. Steering to the N.E. W. by the wind Middle and latter part Equally and Thunder attended with rain, took in and made sail a number of times

Lat. by obs. 19° 43' S. - Long. 146° 42' W.

Wednesday March 1st. Commences with light winds from the W. and fine weather Steering to the N.E. W. by the wind, at 6 P.M. single reefed the P. Sails, Middle part Thunder attended with rain at 8 P.M. the wind shifted to the N.E. Strong winds and rainy weather ends the Day Steering to the N.E. W. Lat. by obs. 18° 41' S. Long. 147° 07' West. - No. obs.

Thursday March 2nd. Commences with Strong winds from the N.E. and rainy, Steering to the N.E. W. by W. Middle part light winds and rain, blue and thick weather, latter part light winds from the Westward and fine weather, Steering on Different Courses variously employed.

Lat. by obs. 18° 31' S. - Long. by account 147° 44' W.

Friday March 3rd. Commences with light winds from the N.E. W. and fine weather Steering to the W. S. W. by the wind, Middle part the same, latter part strong winds and equally attended with rain at 6 P.M. took in the Main Bop G. Sail, at 11 Do. took Ship so ends

Lat. 18° 34' S. - Long. 147° 19' W.

Saturday March 4th. Commences with Strong Gales from the W. N.E. W. Steering to the N.E. by the wind, at 6 P.M. took Ship and Single reefed the P. Sails, took in the Jib Main Sail & Spanker, at 9 Do. took in the Bore and Mizzen Bopsails and Double reefed the Main, Middle part Strong Gales and heavy squalls attended with rain, latter part more moderate at 6 P.M. wore Ship at 9 Do. set the Bore and Mizzen Bop Sails Double reefed, thick and rainy weather ends the Day -

Lat. 18° 18' S. - Long. 148° 31' W.

Sunday March 5th. First and Middle part Strong winds from the W. N.E. W. Steering to the N.E. by the wind under Double reefs, attended with heavy showers of rain, latter part more moderate, at 6 P.M. made Mitea bearing W. by S. 30 mi. Dis. let the reefs out, and set the Jib Main Sail and Spanker, so ends these 24 hours -

Monday March 6th. Commences with light winds from the W. N.E. W. Steering to the Southward by the wind, at 11 P.M. took Ship Middle part equally attended with rain, latter part fine weather All Sail set, so ends at Meridian Mitea bearing S. by W. 25 mi. Dis. -

Tuesday March 7th. First and middle part light winds from the Westward Steering on Different backs by the wind, latter part light airs from the S. E. Steering to the W. by S. 04 Sail in sight of the Lee boat, so ends variously employed, Mitea in sight.

Wednesday March 8th. First part light winds from the S. E. Steering to the W. by S. employed in stowing Down oil, at 3 P.M. made Sahite bearing W. S. W. middle part calm, latter part light winds from the S. E. Steering to the W. S. W. employed in scraping and varnishing the benches, so ends Point Francis bearing S. W. by W. 35 mi. Distance.

Thursday March 9th. Commences with light winds from the S. E. Steering to the W. S. W. at 6 P.M. took in the Main Sail, and Main G. Gall - ant sail, at 10 Do. hove to of Repeta harbor 2 mi. Dis. middle part Calm latter part light airs from the N. E. Calms employed in bending Cables, at 11 P.M. lowered the Waist Boat and went on shore to get a pilot, so ends two Ships in sight, Repeta harbor bearing S. E. 5 mi. Distance.

Friday March 10th. All these 24 hours light airs and calms, lying of Repeta harbor Sahite, in company with the Canton of Harn Bedford, 28 months out 2200 bbls. and the Barclay of Antwerp, 16 months out 700 bbls. All three Ships waiting for a breeze to get in to harbor so ends.

Saturday March 11th. First and Middle part light variable winds and Calms, at 5 P.M. Strong winds from the N.E. W. at 8 P.M. come to anchor in Repeta Harbor, latter part employed in unbending Sails, breaking out Shooks and bolting them ashore, so ends these 24 hours.

Sunday March 12th. First part employed in taking cash ashore sending Down Down the Main Bop gallant sail &c.
