

Wednesday ^{May} 31st. Commences with light winds from the East. wind and fine weather steering to the Southward by the wind at in company with the Richmond; Middle and latter part steering on different tacks so ends Coconut Island bearing S. E. 6 mi. Dis.

Thursday May June 1st. At half past Meridian the Richmond set her Coulers for Whales and lowered her Boats, we lowered 4 Boats but before we could get to the Whales one of the Richmonds Boats fastened and we returned on board without success, at P.M. saw the Richmond Cutting at 110 Am. Saw Sperm Whales and lowered 4 Boats, at half past 110 Am. all 4 Boats Boats fastened the West Boat over the Board, so ends the Richmond in sight Coconut Island bearing S. E. 8 mi. Dis.

Friday June 2nd. At 2 P.M. took 3 whales to the Ship, one to the Schooner, 1st Boats, and Bow Boats, at 3 Do. Commenced Cutting at 1 Do. finished, at 10 Am. commenced boiling, so ends in Company with the Richmond at Meridian Coconut Island bearing S. E. 12 mi. Dis.

Saturday June 3rd. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and fine weather steering on different tacks by the wind, at 6 Am. finished boiling, so ends in Company with the Richmond Coconut Island in sight

Sunday June 4th. All these 24 hours light winds from the E. and fine weather steering on different tacks by the wind in Company with the Ship Richmond, at Meridian Coconut Island bearing S. 14 mi Dis.

Monday June 5th. Commences with light winds from the East. wind at 3 P.M. Capt. Parker went on board the Richmond at 9 Do. returned, at 2 Am. Capt. Parker came on board after iron hoops, at 10 Do. went on board his Ship, and put away to the W. all Sail set employed in breaking out and setting up Shooks.

Lat 16° 52' S. - Long. 176° 39' E.

Tuesday June 6th. Commences with light winds from the E steering to the W. at 2 P.M. saw Sperm Whales and lowered 4 Boats, at 4 Do. returned to the Ship, without success, at 5 Do. took in the S. G. Sails and Double reefed the Pop-Sails. Middle and latter part Strong winds and thick weather attended with Showers of rain, so ends steering to the Westward.

Lat 16° 09' N. - Long. 175° 05' E.

Wednesday June 7th. Commences with Strong Gales from the E. S. E. steering to the W. by N. at 2 P.M. let one reef out of the

Main S. Sail, Middle and latter part sailing at 2 Am close reefed the Main Pop Sail took in the Fore S. Sail, and Fore Sail and let the Ship come to the wind headed to the Southward so ends.

Thursday June 8th. First and Middle part lying to under a close reefed Main Pop-Sail heading to the Southward with Strong Gales from the S. E. and thick weather at 7 Am. put away to the S. W. by W. at 2 Do. set the Fore Sail and Fore-S. Sail Double reefed and let one reef out of the main so ends 2 Boats.

Friday June 9th. Commences with Strong Gales from the E. steering to the S. W. by W. at 2 Am. the wind shifted to the S. W. and Thunder attended with rain, at 7 Do. Strong Gales from the S. E. so ends steering to the S. W. under Double reefs.

Saturday June 10th. First and Middle. Part Strong winds from the S. E. steering to the S. W. by W. under Double reefs. latter part more moderate, so ends Main S. Gallantsail set, employed setting up rigging

Sunday June 11th. Commences with winds from the S. E. and thick weather attended with Showers of rain, at 6 P.M. took in the M. S. Gallantsail Middle part the same, latter part fine weather so ends. steering to the S. W. by W. all sail set - 2 Boats.

Monday June 12th. First part steering to the S. W. with Breeze winds from the S. E. Middle and latter part steering to the W. by N. all sail set so ends employed in fishing the Foremast the

Lat by obs 9° 35' S. - Long by acc. 160° 06' - Sun 163° 00'

Tuesday June 13th. All these 24 hours winds from the E. S. E. steering to the Westward, with fine weather, employed in fishing the Foremasthead and setting up the Main rigging, so ends the Day

Wednesday June 14th. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the S. E. and fine weather, steering to the W. by N. all sail set, employed in setting up and fitting rigging so ends

Friday June 16th. Commences with light winds from the E. and fine weather steering to the W. by N. at 2 P.M. made
