

Malantha Island bearing S. W. the Middle of the Island being layed Down on the Chart in the Long. of $161^{\circ}50'$ E. or there about Middle part part Strong winds winds and thunder attended with rain, heading on Different tacks by the wind under short sail, latter part Steering to the North Westward under single reef, thick weather ends the Day with light showers of rain Malantha in sight to the South Westward - Co. obs.

Saturday June 17th. First part winds from the E. E. and overcast Steering to the S. W. at 6 P. M. Malantha bearing S. W. by S. 18 mi. Dis. Middle part heading on Different by the wind under short sail, at 6 Am. made all sail and Steered to the W. at 10 Am. passed Gowers Island bearing 4 mi. Dis. at Meridian the Island bore S. E. by E. 15 mi Dis. a heavy rain prevented our getting lat. Set of the Island on the Chart $7^{\circ}56'$ S. Long $160^{\circ}45'$ W. Lat. Ship $7^{\circ}46'$ - Long $160^{\circ}35'$

Sunday June 18th. First part Strong winds from the E. S. E. and thick weather with light rain Steering to the W. Middle part Thunder attended with rain heading on Different tacks by the wind under short sail at 5 Am. made all sail and Steered to the W. thick and rainy weather ends the Day - Co. obs. Lat. by Reck. $7^{\circ}24'$ S. - Long $159^{\circ}48'$ W.

Monday June 19th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward and thick weather attended with rain, Steering the W. all sail set at Sunset took in the P. G. Sails and Courses and Double reefed the P. Sails, at 11 P. M. made the Island of Usabel at Daylight made all sail, at 11 Am. saw Sperm whales, and moved 3 Boats at half past 1 P. M. the Boats all fastened so ends some spe- uking Hood, and some not, at Meridian the S. W. end part of Usabel bearing S about 18 or 20 mi. Dis. quite a large Island and the S. W. part lies in the lat $7^{\circ}14'$ S. Long $158^{\circ}00'$ E. or there abouts

Tuesday June 20th. At 4 P. M. took 5 whales to the Ship, 2 to S. B. 1 to the L. B. 1 to the W. B. and 1 to the B. B. Shortened sail and headed to the S. with winds from the E. by S. E. attended with heavy showers of rain, Middle part the same, latter part more moderate at 6 Am. commenced cutting, at 11 Am. finished, so ends empty - yed in clearing up the Decks - Co. obs. At Meridian Usabel in sight. - The S. W. part of S. W. Georgia bearing S. W. 25 mi Dis.

Wednesday June 21st. All these 24 brisk Breezes from

the S. E. heading on Different tacks by the wind under short sail employed in boiling at 4 P. M. saw Sperm whales but soon lost the rim of them and did not lower, at 11 Am. saw sperm whales so ends Steering for the Whales

Lat. $6^{\circ}49'$ S. - Thursday June 22nd. at 1 P. M. lowered 3 Boats and fast- - ned at 3 Do. took 3 Whales to the Ship one to the L. B. one to the W. B. & one to the B. B. at 5 Do. finished boiling the other whales, at 6 Am. Commenced cutting at 11 Do. finished, so ends the Middle of S. W. Georgia bearing S. 20 mi. Dis.

Friday June 23rd. At 1 P. M. commenced boiling, and fine weather, with winds from the S. E. & middle and latter part a few light showers of rain, so ends boiling.

Lat by obs. $6^{\circ}32'$ S. the Mid. of S. W. Georgia bearing S. E. Saturday June 24th. Bist and Middle part light winds from the E. S. E. steering on Different tacks by the wind under short sail, at 4 P. M. finished boiling, latter part Steering West sail set, at Meridian the West end of S. W. Georgia bearing S. W. by S. by Compass, whose Long. is $156^{\circ}30'$ Lat. $6^{\circ}30'$ S. Lat by obs. $6^{\circ}28'$ S.

Sunday June 25th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward Steering to the Westward, at Sunset shortened sail and come to by the wind at 4 P. M. made all sail and Steered to the west middle & latter part squally, attended with light showers of rain so ends the middle of Bougainville Island bearing S. in sight, which lies in the lat. $5^{\circ}50'$ S. Long $155^{\circ}30'$ E. or there abouts, Co. obs.

Monday June 26th. All these 24 hours light winds from E. to S. E. Steering to the Westward, lying under short sail through the night At Meridian the the S. part of Boukai bearing W. 18 mi. Dis. the S. W. Part of the Island lies in the lat. $4^{\circ}52'$ S. - Long. $154^{\circ}25'$ E.

Tuesday June 27th. All these 24 hours light winds from the E. and Eastward, and a strong Current setting to the S. W. Steering on Different tacks by the wind, latter part employed in stowing Down oil, so ends Rariv's Island and Boukai in sight, Lat. $4^{\circ}28'$ S.

Wednesday June 28th. Commences with light winds from the S. E. Steering on Different tacks by the wind at 4 P. M. finished Stowing Down, Middle part winds from the S. E. by E. and squally attended with light showers of rain, latter part Ste
