

Lat 0...00 - - - Long 134...08 E.

Friday July 28th. Commences with Strong winds from the S.E. Steering to the W. & N. at Sunset made Rev. Guinea on our Labour. Bore took in the Main S.E. Sail, Jib & Mainsail and steered to the W. At Daylight more moderate, made all Sail, latter part thick weather attended with Showers of rain at Meridian 2 Rev. Guinea Cape good Hope bore S.E. and a number of other Islands in sight to the Westward, Lat. by obs 0.00 - Long 132.11 E. according to Epitome

Saturday July 29th. First part Strong winds from the S. E. Steering Down for the Straits of New Guinea then in eight Middle part variable winds and equally attended with Thunder and rain, heading on Different backs under short Sail, at Day light found ourselves in the Straits of New Guinea with light winds from the W. made all Sail and Steered to the Southward by the wind at 7 o'clock saw sperm Whales and lowered 4 Boats at 8 o'clock the Boats all parted at 8 Do the L. & W. Boats parted their lines, at 9 Do. parted again, the Boat parted again in the course of 3 minutes, the Starboard & Bow Boats took their Whales to the Ship at 10 Do. & commenced cutting, at 11 Do. the W. Boat returned to the Ship with the loss of craft and some line as usual at 12 o'clock the L. Boat took her Whale to the Ship so ended cutting the Whales the W. part of New Guinea bearing S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. the S. E. part of Wangion I. bearing S. E. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 15 mi. Dis. called P. 394.

Sunday July 30th. Commenced with light winds from the W. and fine weather Steering to the S. E. all Sail set, at 2 P. M. finished cutting, at 4 P. M. commenced boiling and hauled our wind to the S. P. at 3 P. M. had a heavy Breeze put the Ship under short Sail and wore Down the masts, at 3 P. M. started the masts again, Middle and Latter part Night variable winds and thick weather attended with Thunder, Steering on Different Courses with a two not Current setting to the westward, so ends in the entering of the Straits of St. Pinguine boiling Whales

Monday, July 31st. Commenced with winds from the S.W. and thick weather; at 3 P.M. finished boiling the Body, commenced raining, cooled down the works, at 10 P.M. the rain ceased & commenced boiling the Head, at 3 P.M. finished, latter employed in melting hole in washing Decks &c. &c. several Steer- ing on different tracks by the river -

Bowin through the Lamiere Straits.

Tuesday August 1st. Commenced with light winds from the S. and fine weather & tacking on different tacks by the wind at 8 AM. had a light breeze from the S. E. took in the P. E. Sails and hauled the Coiruses up and headed to the S. W. at 4 PM. had a fine breeze from the S. E. made all sail and steered to the Westward Point Light bearing S. E. $1/2$ E. 10 mi. Dis. King William's Isle W. by S. 40° E. from Point S. S. E. by S. $1/2$ S. 5 mi. Dis. at Champsfield S. S. E. by E. $1/2$ E. 9 mi. Dis. Pigeon Island W. by S. $1/4$ S. 6 mi. Dis. the W. end of King William I. W. by S. $1/4$ E. 14 mi. Dis. Steering W. S. W. at 12 30 ends almost surrounded by ice, the latter part of the day saw a flock of terns with

Wednesday August 2nd. Commenced with light winds from the
E. S. E. at 1 P.M. the tide turned against us, at 2 o'clock. Calm
could not stem the current let go the anchor in 33 fathoms of
water, Pigeon I. bore W. 4 mi. Dis. Augusta Island W. 1/4 S. the W.
end of King Wm. Island W. N. W. Towl S. S. E. by E. 4 or 5 mi. Dis. Mar-
-shall I. S. by E. the current set N. E. 2 1/2 knots two canoes came off to
us with a few shells, while at anchor the west end Battanta bore
S. W. 1/4 W. at half past 5 slack water at 6 the Ship Sailing round
at 7 the tide set S. W. by W. from 9 to midnight it ran 5 or 6 knots
then slackened away to about 3 knots at 4 P.M. bore up with light winds
from the S. W. at dawn the wind shifted to the S. E. W. and equally at
half past 8 o'clock discovered a shoal water West 3/4 of a mile that the tide
run over in ripples backed to the S. E. Pigeon I. bearing E. by S. 3/4 S. 10
or 12 mi. Dis. Augusta I. E. N. E. Cape Mabo South, at Brown Fishers
Isle, S. by E. 1/4 E. the W. part of Batanta E. by N. thick weather and

Thursday August 3rd. Commenced with strong winds from the S.E. by E. Steering to the Southward by the wind, all sail set at 4 P.M. found we could not weather Boles Papa tacked Ship, standing on different tacks through the night, latter part steering to the S.W. with light winds from the S.E. leaving a number of Islands on our leeward hand at dawn the S.E. part of Boles Papa bearing S.W. & E.

Friday August 4th. First part Calm Middle part Strong winds
from the S.E. Steering to the S.W. by E. at 10 P.M. took in the Main
Royal, & G. Mizzen Bopgallant sails, At Daylight Began bore from S.W.
to E.S.E. set the Royals & Studing sails with moderate winds from the E.
and steered to the S.W. at 4 P.M. the N.E. part of Bearn bore E.S.E. the
