

Saturday August 5th This Day Calm and light airs from the Eastward heading to the N.W. to keep clear of the land their being some swell bearing from the S.W. the watch employed in making rattling rope at Noon the N.W. part of Ceram bore S.W. 3/4 W. the S.E. part of Bonoa W. S. W. Lat. by obs. 2° 46 S.

Lat. of Bonoa 3° 00 S. - Long. 127° 56 E. by Epitome  
Sunday August 6th. First part Calm at P.M. took a strong Breeze from the S. and Steered to the W. by S. at Midnight Bonoa bore S. at 2 Am. hoisted our main to the W. S. W. at 9 Do. made Bours ahead, took in the Fore & Mizzen P. G. Sails at Noon tacked Ship the Middle of Bours bearing S. Lat by obs. 3° 01 S.  
Bours Island S.E. part Lat. 3° 15 S. Long. 127° 05 E. by Epitome

Monday August 7th. This Day Strong winds from the S.E. C. Steering on different tacks by the wind took in and made some sail a number of times At Noon the E. part of Bours bore S. and a number more Islands in sight to the South-Eastward so ends -  
Lat. by obs. 3° 06 S.

Tuesday August 8th. Commences with Strong Gales from the S.E. Steering on different tacks by the wind between Bours & Manipa Middle part the same, latter part moderate, at Noon, the S.E. part of Manipa & the S.E. part of Oclang just in range with the S.W. Part of Ceram, bore S.E. 1/4 E. - the S.P. of Ambau S. bore S.W. by S. so ends  
Lat. 3° 45 S. - Long.

Wednesday August 9th. First part Steering on different tacks Middle and latter part Steering to the Southward with Strong winds from the S.E. and clear weather, the water almost white as milk through the night, - so ends nothing more to be seen  
Lat 4° 55 S. - Long. 127° 03 E.

Thursday August 10th. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the S.E. Steering to the Southward by the wind, so ends the watch employed  
Lat 6° 19 S. - Long. 126° 28 E.

Friday August 11th. First and Middle part Strong Gales from the S.E. Steering to the Southward by the wind Latter part moderate employed in setting up the P. G. Mast Rigger Water Island in sight, at Noon the S.W. part of the Island bore S.W. 1/2 S -  
Lat. by obs. 7° 22 S. Long. by Rec 126° 15 E. - Long. E. P. of the I. 126° 54 East.

Saturday August 12th. Commences with light winds from the E. Steering to the E. by W. light variable winds through the night at 4 P.M. took a strong breeze from the E. S. E. took in the Royals, Fore & Mizzen P. Gallant sails at Daylight Puls Cambing bore S by E.

Bound through the Simor Straits.

Ombay to the Westward Water Island to the Eastward and the high lands of Simor to the South at Noon the Point of Cambing the S. E. Point of Ombay N.W. the Point of Simor nearest Ombay S.W. by S 1/4 S. so ends in the straits of Simor Lat. by obs. 2° 22 S.

Sunday August 13th. Commences with light winds from the Northward Steered to to the westward along the Island of Simor at 4 P.M. took a strong Breeze from the E. at sunset took in the Royals, Fore & Mizzen P. G. Sails, Jib and M. Sail, at Daylight Battal bore S.W. E. 5 or 6 mi. Dis. made all sail, latter part fine weather with light winds from the S. at Noon the nearest part of Simor bearing S.E. 15 miles Distance Lat. by obs. 9° 23 South.

Monday August 14th. First light winds and variables at 8 P.M. took a fine Breeze from the E. S. E. got the Studingsail, and Steered to the W. S. W. at 8 Am. made land ahead Steered to the W. S. W. by S. to clear the Land, at Noon the nearest part of the Island bore S.W. 1/2 W. 2 mi. Dis. Bava is the name of the Island by Epitome Lat 10° 37 S. Long 122° 00 E. by Epitome, the Island is quite Extensive  
Lat. by obs 10° 26

Tuesday August 15th. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the E. by S. Steering to the W. S. W. all sail set, at 4 P.M. passed an Island bearing S. 16 mi. Dis. so ends nothing more to be remarked,  
Lat. 11° 14 S. - Long. 119° 32 East.

Wednesday August 16th. All these 24 hours Fresh gales from the E. by S. Steering to the W. S. W. all sail set and fine weather, variously employed  
Lat. 12° 02 S. - Long. 116° 39 E.

Thursday August 17th. All these 24 hours fresh Gales from E. S. E. and fine weather Steering to the W. S. W. at 2 Am. spoke the Bark Griffen of London 34 mo. out 1700 bbls. so ends variously employed.  
Lat 12° 54 S. - Long. 104° 57 E.

Friday August 18th. At half past Meridian saw Sporn whales, at 1 P.M. the Scho lowered 4 Boats, the Staboard Boat fastened and parted the line, pursued the Whales until 4 Do. and returned to the Ship without success, large whale lost by a bad line, at 5 Do. put away to the W. S. W. at Studing sails and royals and Royals as usual with winds from the E. by S. and fine weather, Middle and latter part the same employed in reefing and filling the Fore. Main Top sail so ends  
Lat. 13° 32 S. - Long. 111° 58 E.

Saturday August 19th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the E. and fine weather Steering to the W. S. W. all sail set latter part employed in stowing Down oil, - Lat 14° 27 S. - Long 109° 58 East.
