

the Standing sails and Royals, hauled our wind to the S.W. and bent the Cables, at 6 Do. took in the Topgallantsails and Mainsail, at 8 Do. took in the Ship, at 10 Do. took again to the S.W. at 6 Do. Rodrigue bore S.W. by W. made all Sail and Steered for the Island at 8 Do. took in the Royals, at 10 Do. took in the P.G. Sails, at 11 Do. the middle of the Island bore S.W. by S. 2 mi. Dis. the Capt. lowered down his Boat and pulled in near the shore, and spoke a Canoe, and on board again

Friday Sept. 8th. at 1 P.M. took a Pilot, at 2 Do. let go the anchor in 12 fathoms of water, two Boats went on shore after wood, and the remainder of the Crew variously employed on board about the rigging, latter part some of the Crew on shore cutting wood and filling water and some on board setting up the Topmast backstays &c. &c.

Saturday Sept. 9th. First part employed in getting of wood and water and a few fowls and Yams, at 6 Am. hove short and lowered a Boat and put Joel Woodman on shore for bad conduct, two more deserted the Boat at the same time, at 8 Do. took the anchor and went out the harbor and hove to, to wait for the Boat, at 9 Do. the Boat returned made all sail and Steered to the W. S.W. at 10 Do. Rodrigue bore S.W. by S. ^{inst. on} 1/2 S. -
Lat. 19° 41 S. - - - - - Long. 63° 00 East.

Sunday Sept. 10th. All these 24 hours strong winds from E. to S. S. E. Steering to the W. S.W. all sail set, Middle and latter part equally, took in and set the Royals a number of times so ends -
Lat. 20° 42 S. - - - - - Long. 60° 30 East.

Monday Sept. 11th. All these 24 hours light winds from the S. E. and fine weather Steering to the W. by S. 1/2 S. all sail set employed in Sail mending
Lat. 21° 50 - - - - - Long. 57° 46 East.

Tuesday Sept. 12. First and Middle part winds from the S. S. E. and Cloudy Steering to the W. by S. 1/2 S. latter part winds from the E. S. E. and clear weather employed Sail mending so ends these 24 hours
Lat. 22° 56 S. - - - - - Long. 55° 52 East.

Wednesday Sept. 13th. Commences with brisk winds from the S. E. by E. and fine weather, Steering to the W. by S. 1/2 S. Middle part thick weather and squally attended with Showers of rain, latter part light winds from the E. and fine weather employed in Sail mending
Lat. 24° 00 S. - - - - - Long. 54° 02 East.

Thursday Sept. 14th. Commences with light winds from the S. E. Steering to the W. by S. Middle and latter part light winds from the S. E. and Calms employed in Sail mending so ends these 24 hours
Lat. 24° 10 S. - - - - - Long. 53° 02 East.

Friday Sept. 15th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastern and Calms with fine weather, Steering to the W. by S. variously employed
Lat. 24° 16 S. - - - - - Long. 52° 19 East.

Saturday Sept. 16th. Commences with light winds from the S. E. Steering to the W. by S. Middle and latter part brisk winds from the S. E. and pleasant weather, so ends variously employed
Lat. 24° 53 S. - - - - - Long. 50° 36 E.

Sunday Sept. 17th. All these 24 hours strong winds from the S. E. to E. S. E. Steering to the W. by S. latter part thick weather & squally
Lat. 26° 06 S. - - - - - Long. 47° 57 East.

Monday Sept. 18th. First and Middle part strong Gale from the E. S. E. and thick weather, attended with squalls, latter part more moderate, Steering to the W. all sail set employed in Sail mending
Lat. 27° 05 S. - - - - - Long. 44° 53 East.

Tuesday Sept. 19th. Commences with fresh Gale from the E. S. E. and pleasant weather, Middle and latter part light winds so ends. Steering to the W. employed in Sail mending a Ship in sight
Lat. 27° 33 S. - - - - - Long. 42° 43 E.

Wednesday Sept. 20th. Commences with light winds from the E. S. E. and fine weather, at 2 P.M. the Ship in company being sight ahead 6 mi. Dis. and nearly calm lowered a boat and boarded her it proved to be a Dutch Ship from Batavia bound to Rotterdam he gave us some coffee, Peas, and Beans, and in return we sent him a bag of Bread and a few Gallons of oil Middle part fresh breezes, latter part light, so ends Steering to the W. by S. in Co. with the Dutch Ship

Thursday Sept. 21st. First and Middle part light winds from S. E. to S. W. and fine weather, latter part strong winds from the S. S. W. and Cloudy, so ends Steering to the westward
Lat. 28° 32 S. by acc. - - - - - Long. 40° 35 East.

Friday Sept. 22nd. Commences with strong winds from the S. E. W. Steering to the W. by S. at 3 P.M. spoke the Ship Maria Theresa, Barber of Barb. Bedford 15 months out 900 bbls. of Whale oil & 500 Sperrm Capt. Parker went on board, at 11 Do. returned Middle and latter part light variable winds and calms with thick weather so ends
Lat. 28° 34 S. - - - - - Long. 39° 45 East.

Saturday Sept. 23rd. First and Middle part strong Gale from the S. W. Steering to W. S. W. by the thick weather attended with squalls, latter part more moderate at 6 P.M. Carried away the Main P. Gallant Yards in the shins nothing more to be remarked
