

Thursday Nov. 14th. to the N.W. all Sail set, Middle part winds from the S.E. by N. at Midnight took in the Studding sails latter part squally, attended with showers of rain so ends these 24 hours.
Lat 33-28 N. - Long 43-30 W.

Friday Nov. 23rd. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the N.W. by the wind employed in sail mending - Current one mile per hour setting W. N.W. -
Lat 14-42 N. - Long 45-48 West.

Saturday Nov. 24th. All these 24 hours light winds from the N. by E. and a heavy head swell on Steering to the N.W. by W. by the wind, all Sail set so ends variously employed -
Lat 15-29 N. - Long 47-38 W.

Sunday Nov. 25th. Commences with light winds from the N.W. by the wind, Middle and latter part winds from the E. so ends variously employed -
Lat 16-07 N. - Long 48-38 W.

Monday Nov. 26th. All these 24 hours winds from the E. N. E. Steering to the N.W. 1/2 N. all Sail set with Pleasant weather -
Lat 17-29 N. - Long 50-00 W.

Tuesday Nov. 27th. All these 24 hours winds from the E. and fine weather Steering to the N.W. all Sail set, variously employed -
Lat 18-48 N. - Long 51-40 W.

Wednesday Nov. 28th. First and Middle part Strong winds from the N.E. by N. Steering to the N.W. all Sail set, latter part winds from the E. so ends employed in Sail mending -
Lat 20-12 N. - Long 53-10 West.

Thursday Nov. 29th. Commences with brisk winds from the E. and fine weather Steering to the N.W. 1/2 W. all Sail set, Middle part Strong winds from E. N. E. to N. E. and equally attended with Showers of rain, took in the Studding sails and Royals latter part fine again so ends all Sail set employed in Sail mending.
Lat 21-30 N. - Long 55-11 West.

Friday Nov. 30th. Commences with winds from the E. and hazy Steering to the N.W. 1/2 W. at 6 P.M. took in the Royals, and Studding sails, at 8 Do. took in the Fore & Mizzen P. Gallantsails, and Main Sail, Middle part variable winds and equally attended with lightning and heavy rain at 6 P.M. set the Jib, Spanker, Main Sail, and Topgallantsails, at 8 Do. sent down the Fore & Mizzen Royal yards, latter part strong Gales from the E. and steady rain so ends these 24 hours -

Saturday Dec. 1st. Commences with Strong Gales from the E. S. E. Steering

to the N.W. 1/2 W. at 4 P.M. took in the Fore & Mizzen Topgallantsails Jib, and Main Sail, Middle and latter part pleasant Gales from the S.W. and fine weather so ends all Sail set.

Saturday Dec. 2nd. Commences with light winds from the E. and fine weather Steering to the N.W. by W. at Midnight the wind hauled to S. S. E. latter part light variable winds and squally attended with rain Steering on Different Courses, so ends these 24 hours -

Sunday Dec. 3rd. First part light winds from the S.W. and squally Steering to the N.W. by W. all Sail set at 2 P.M. unbent the Fore-Sail and bent another at 5 Do. took in the Studding sails, and Main Sail, Middle part variable winds attended with heavy squalls of rain, latter part light winds from the S.E. and fine weather so ends all Sail set.

Tuesday Dec. 5th. All these 24 hours light winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the N.W. by W. all Sail set. Saw several Sail so ends employed in Sail mending &c. -

Wednesday Dec. 6th. All these 24 hours light winds from S. E. to E. S. E. and pleasant Steering to the N.W. 1/2 W. all Sail set employed in Scraping and varnishing the beads, Sail mending &c. -
Lat 28-08 N. - Long 65-27 West.

Thursday Dec. 7th. Commences with light winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the N.W. all Sail set, at 8 P.M. had a squall from the E. S. E. took in the Studding sails and Main Royal, at 10 Do. under Double reefs Jib, and Spanker in, Middle part thick weather attended with light showers of rain, at 2 P.M. let out the reefs latter part fine weather and light winds from the S.E. so ends all Sail set.
Lat 29-01 N. - Long 66-16 West.

Friday Dec. 8th. Commences with light winds from the Eastward and fine weather Steering to the N.W. found the head of the Fore-Sail to be badly sprung sent down the S. S. Gallant Yards & Mast, Middle and latter part, light airs from the N.W. at Daylight Commenced on getting down our S. S. Mast, at 11 Do. had another one up and the Top sail hoisted to the Masthead, so ends these 24 hours one Sail in sight -
Lat 29-11 N. - Long 66-56 W.

Saturday Dec. 9th. First part light airs from the N.W. Gales, at 4 P.M.
