

Journal of the Western Islands

Sun June ^{the 29th} these 24 hours comm with light
breezes from S.W. steering E. & N. to the
middle part Light airs from from W.N.W.
and steering E. & N. E. so ends this 24 hours.
Lat 38-00 N. Long 34-20 W.

Mon June ^{the 30th} these 24 hours comm with light
breezes from W.N.W. steering N.E. by E
at 10 P.M. spoke Ship St. George of
New Bedford no oil the middle & latter
part fine weather and 3 ships in sight
so ends. Lat 38-59 N. Long 35-20 W.

Tues July ^{the 1st} these 24 hours comm with fresh
breezes from N. & steering E. by S at 8.
10 P.M. left to under short sail as the Land
not far off at 10 P.M. steering E. at 5 made
the Land, the Island of Phoenix bearing N. to
West 15 Miles. Latter part a strong wind and
steering S. E. by S so ends this 24 hours.
Lat 38-28 N. Long 30-20 W.

Wed July ^{the 2nd} these 24 hours comm with strong
breezes from N. and steering S. E. under
short sail the weather squally and saw
a number of vessels at 11 A.M. saw the
Islands of Pico & Fayal dist 25 Miles the latter
part strong gales and steering E. S. E.
Lat 38-08 N. Long 29-00 W.

Thurs July ^{the 3rd} these 24 hours comm with fresh
breezes from the N. and at steering E. S. E.
at 1 P.M. saw the Island of St. Michaels
bearing E. S. E. 35 Miles dist and at 8
left to for the night at 8 A.M. stood
in for the Land at 8 spoke the Ship
Martha of New Port 70 days out no oil at 9
board a boat and sent her in at 12 the
name of and in school of Shore
Lat 38 N. Long 27 W.

Friday July ^{the 4th} these 24 hours comm with light
breezes from N. and lying of and on the
Land under short sail at 8 A.M. board
a boat and the Captain went on shore for
to stay 3 weeks and a Man and boy with
him so ends this 24 hours

Sat July ^{the 5th} these 24 hours comm with fresh
breezes from W.N.W. a 1/2 past Meridian the
boat came of and we had to Sea heading
S.W. at 8 had to the N. and heading
up round the N. part of the Island, and
the weather squally the latter part heading
of Shore W.N.W. and the Wind S.W. and
bearing E. by N. so ends Long 28-120

Sunday ^{the 6th} of July these 24 hours comm with strong
Winds from N. and heading W.N.W. at
4 P.M. were Ship to the Eastward and the
N.W. part of the Island bearing E. S. E. dist
25 Miles the middle and latter part fine
weather and all sail set at Meridian of
the W. part of the Land dist 15 Miles
so ends Lat 37-44 N. Long 28-18 W.

Monday ^{the 7th} of July begins with fine weather and
from N. and heading E. S. E. and the
Northmost part of the Land bearing E. by N.
S. at 7 P.M. the W. part bearing E. W. dist
18 Miles Eastmost part bearing S. E. by S.
dist 25 Miles and we took in Light Vails
& doubled up at 7 A.M. stood in to the Bay
with a fine breeze from N.W. & employed a skiff
up the head Staged & forth at Meridian we
were in the Bay a running down along the
Shore with all sail set so ends this
24 hours one sail in sight to the S. E.
