

Ship C. W. Morgan about the Western Islands
Sunday July 13th 1845 Begins with fine breeze
& pleasant weather at 2 P.M. hauled of shore
to the N.E. wind N.W. and employed
a sloop up part of day and one ship
in sight to the S.W. of the land bearing
W by S 1/2 S. Dist 38 miles the middle part
fine at 5 P.M. took in shore and hands employed
a boat the rigging so ended the 24 hours with
light air Lat 38-19 N. Long

Wednesday July 14th 1845 begins with
light breeze from N.W. by N. and heading in
to St. Michaels Bay at 4 P.M. were ship
of heading S.E. to at 7 past 5 P.M. took
3 boats to practice pulling the middle &
Latter the sun and saw one barque steering
to the eastward so ended this day
Lat 38-55 N. Long 28-50 W.

Thursday July 15th 1845 begins with fine breeze
from N.W. by W. heading N. at 7 P.M. took
in light sails and sent ship to the S.W.
the middle light air heading W by S
Latter fine breeze and the island of
Ascension bearing W by W by N. and
saw 3 sail so ended Lat 38-39 N. Long 28-38

Friday July 16th 1845 begins with light air
from N.W. by W. and heading W by W by N.
the island bearing W by W. Dist 15 miles
at 7 P.M. sent ship to the S.W. for the night
heading W. middle & Latter part calm and
St. George in sight bearing N.W. so ended
all this day Lat 38-14 N. Long 29-08

Saturday July 17th 1845 begins with light air
from W.W. middle part calm and the middle &
Latter part light air heading S. sail in sight
so ended Lat 38-44 N. Long 29-40 W.

Ship C. W. Morgan of the West Islands
Sunday July 18th 1845 begins with light
breeze from S.E. to heading S at 2 P.M.
spoke barque Hope of New Bedford then
at 4 we sent ship to the S. and 3 ships
& a barque to Leeward middle & Latter part
light breeze from S.E. and steering in
for St. Michaels so at the end of 15 miles

Lat 38-00 N. Long 35-55 W.
Monday July 18th 1845 begins with fine
breeze from S.E. and running in along
the W. end of the island at 3 past 5 P.M.
a fleet of sail to the S.E. but saw nothing
to day middle & Latter part fine weather and
crucising of and on the bay but saw nothing
Lat 38-1 N. Long

Tuesday July 19th 1845 begins with fine
breeze from S. and crucising of the S.E. of
St. Michaels & saw one ship to Leeward
middle & Latter light breeze and at work on
Lower rigging so ended Lat 38-15 N. Long 35-40

Wednesday July 20th 1845 begins with
calm weather and crucising of the bay
& employed at the lower rigging one
sail in sight to the westward the middle
& Latter part light air & calm and employed
fitting lower rigging & so forth and 85
sail of vessels in sight Lat 38-25 N.
Long 35-40 W.

Thursday July 21st 1845
begins with light air from W by W.
and heading in for the land & employed
at work on rigging and 13 sail of vessels
in sight heading to the eastward the
middle & Latter part fresh breeze from
S.W. & in company with the James
Murray of N. Bedford so ended the
24 hours Lat
Long
