

Ship C. W. Morgan of the Western Island
Friday July 18th 1845 begins with fresh breezes
from S.W. and heading W.N.W. at 4
the weather cloudy and rained some
I saw Black Fish several got none at
7 spoke ship James Mearns of N. Bedford
at the middle & latter part fine breezes from
S.W. and heading S.E. & so ends this
24 hours Lat 37-34 N Long

Saturday July 19th 1845 begins with fine
breezes from S.W. and heading S.E.
& employed about ship duty at 7 P.M.
saw ship to the N.W. the middle & latter
part fine weather and heading S.E.
the land bearing N.E. Lat 37-31 N
Long

Sunday July 20th 1845 begins with light
breezes from N.E. and on the lower
side of St. Michael steering S.E. at 7
was ship to the Westward one ship in
sight of us the middle & latter part fine
breezes from N.W. and St. Marys in
sight bearing S.E. & so ends this 24 hours
Lat 37-03 N Long 20-23 W

Monday July 21st 1845 begins with fine
breezes from S. and cloudy weather
& heading E.N.E. & the Islands of St.
Marys and St. Michael in sight and
one sail the middle & latter part fine weather
& the wind W.N.W. and heading N.W.
ends Lat 37-21 N Long 20-03 W

Tuesday July 22nd 1845 begins with fine breezes
from N.W. and clear weather heading N. at
7 P.M. took in sail for the night middle
& latter part rainy and wind N.W. & E.
& N.E. and a warp about the ship
Lat Long

Ship C. W. Morgan About N.W. Island
Wednesday July 23rd 1845
begins with light breezes from S.E.
heading N.W. and the weather
raining middle & latter part fine weather
and employed about ship and cooping
the oil so ends Lat

Thursday July 24th 1845 begins with fine
weather and light air and the land about
20 miles off at 7 P.M. shortened sail for
the night the middle & latter part light
air and some squalls of rain and heading of
for the weather part of the land & employed
cooping oil and breaking out the run
& so forth Lat Long

Friday July 25th 1845
begins with light
breezes from the Westward and heading
N.W. at 7 P.M. took in light
sails and left with the main yard
a back at 8 P.M. standing in for the harbor
of St. Michael for the Captain at 9 P.M.
so lowered a boat and went on shore
& so ends

Saturday July 26th 1845
begins with calm and of the harbor at
10 the boat came of and at 6 we lowered the
boat to tow the ship off shore at 8 the Capt
came of and we got of our potatoes and beans
& so forth heading of shore with a light
air from S at 10 steering W.N.W. for
Zagat to land our oil the latter part a
fine breeze from S. and employed about
the ship Lat Long

Sunday July 27th 1845 begins
with fine weather at 8 P.M. saw St.
George and Pico St. George bearing N.W. &
& Pico W.N.W. 7 miles off the latter part fine
weather Lat Long W
