

Ship C. W. Morgan in the South Atlantic  
Friday August 29<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Begins with fresh breezes from S. E. and  
steering S. W. by W. with all sail set and  
only brig. under our lee the middle and  
latter part fine and employed about  
the rigging Lat 4-07 S. Long 22-00 W.

Saturday August 30<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Begins with fine breeze from S. E. and  
steering S. W. by W. with all sail set  
the latter part squalls of rain and a  
fine breeze so wind Lat 8-40 S. Long 24-30 W.

Sunday August 31<sup>st</sup> 1845  
Begins with fine breeze from S. E. and  
steering S. W. and the weather thick & wind  
rain the middle and latter part fresh breeze  
& pleasant weather & steering S. W. by S.  
wind Lat 8-55 S. Long 25-45 W.

Monday September 1<sup>st</sup> 1845  
Begins with fresh breeze and steering S. W.  
with all sail set the middle the same  
latter fine and employed about the ship  
& saw one ship to the South so wind  
Lat 10-29 S. Long 27-35 W.

Tuesday September 2<sup>nd</sup> 1845  
Begins with fine breeze from S. E. and  
steering S. W. by W. the middle and  
latter part squally and the wind  
S. E. Lat 12-11 S. Long 29-50 W.

Wednesday Sept 3<sup>rd</sup> 1845  
Begins with fresh breeze and steering  
S. W. by W. with all sail set the latter  
part fine breeze and employed a firing  
the Spanker and so forth  
Lat 14-30 S. Long 31-50 W.

Bound South & around the Cape of Good Hope  
Thursday Sept 4<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Begins with light breeze and steering  
S. W. by W. and S. sail in sight the  
middle and latter part fresh winds  
and light sails in at 9 AM spoke  
a Gallicianian brig. so wind the wind  
S. E. and steering S. W. by W.  
Lat 15-30 S. Long 33-10

Friday Sept 5<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Begins with strong gales from S. E.  
and steering S. W. by W. at 5 PM reef  
top sail the middle and latter part strong  
winds and steering S. W. so wind  
Lat 17-32 S. Long 35-50 W.

Saturday Sept 6<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Begins with fine weather and steering  
W. and employed a firing a. S. Spanker and  
S. aft at 4 PM saw a large whale  
and at 5 Lowered but ~~did not~~ sight came on  
and did not get fast at 6 came on board  
and laid by for the night the latter  
part fine weather and steering S. W.  
so wind Lat 19-34 S. Long 37-00 W.

Sunday Sept 7<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Begins with fine breeze from S. E. and  
steering to the South the middle part  
sailing by for the night the latter part heavy  
squalls from E. and reef down and  
steering S. Lat 18-33 S. Long 37-14 W.

Monday Sept 8<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Begins with heavy squalls from East  
and under short sail steering S. middle  
more pleasant the latter part clear weather  
and strong winds so wind the 24  
hour Lat 20-44 S. Long
