

Ship C. W. Morgan, Outward Bound 1845
 Tuesday Sept 9th 1845
 Begins with fresh winds from E. steering S.
 and imployed a gitinge saily for a high latitude
 and down royal yard and bearing new brace
 & so partly the latter part fine weather and
 imployed about the ship so regd these
 24 hours Lat 23.25 S Long 37=15 W

Wednesday Sept 10th 1845
 Begins with fresh breezes from E. steering
 S. E. at 8 AM saw a brig steering N. E. W.
 the latter part fine weather and heading
 S. E. by S. Lat 25.14 S Long 35.11 S W

Thursday Sept 11th 1845
 Begins with fresh breezes from E. & E.
 and steering S. E. by S. at 8 AM past
 a bark steering N. W. and saw a speckled
 Healed the latter part fine breezes from
 N. E. steering S. E. Lat 28.49 S Long 32=30 W

Friday Sept 12th 1845
 Begins with fresh wind from N. E. &
 steering S. E. and at 4 PM. set the
 the 2nd mast studding sail the middle
 part the wind from S. W. and blowing
 strong took in light sails and set the
 fore & main topsail latter more moderate
 and Head S. W. and made all sail so
 ended Lat 30.44 S Long 30=15 W

Saturday Sept 13th 1845
 Begins with fresh winds from S. W. and
 steering S. E. the middle part light and
 from S. E. at 3 PM took a heavy squall
 from the S. and heavy rain and all hands
 had to take in sail & took in all but main
 sails the latter part heavy rains and more
 moderate Wind Lat 34=14 S Long 29=20 W

Ship C. W. Morgan, Outward Bound 1845
 Sunday Sept 14th 1845
 Begins with fresh breezes from S. E. and
 sailing heading S. E. & under double reef
 fore sails at 7 PM. were ship to the S.
 the latter heading East and the weather thick
 & well -- Lat 31=08 S Long 29=00 W

Monday Sept 15th 1845
 Begins with moderate winds from the South
 and a heavy swell and heading to the East
 the middle calm at 2 PM. took a breeze
 from N. W. and steering S. E. with all sail
 but the latter part blowing a Gale and
 put her under double reef top sails and
 with a bad sea on Lat 31=35 S Long 27=10 W

Tuesday Sept 16th 1845
 Begins with strong gales from W. and
 a high sea & steering S. E. under double reef
 fore sails the middle and latter strong gale
 from W. to end Lat 32=20 S Long 25=33 W

Wednesday Sept 17th 1845
 Begins with strong gales from W. S. W. and
 steering S. E. under double reef top
 sails the middle and latter part heavy
 winds and squalls of rain and steering
 S. E. sound Lat 33=25 S Long 21=04 W

Thursday Sept 18th 1845
 Begins with strong gale from W. S. W.
 and steering S. E. at 8 PM. took in
 main topsail and gave the middle and
 latter part more moderate and put all
 sail on her to end Lat 35=00 Long 19=00 W
