

Ship to W. Morgan Acrossing the Indian Ocean
Tuesday Sept 30th 1845

Begins with strong wind from the North
and steering S. E. by E and Light sails in
and saw six Whales the middle and latter
fresh breezes from N. and rainy weather
so much. Lat 38.55 S Long 171.30 E

Wednesday Sept 1st 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the North
and steering S. E. by E. the middle and
latter part fine and employ a fitting
boat and so forth Lat 38.51 S Long 18.00 E

Thursday October 2nd 1845

Begins with light breezes from the North
and all sail set at 8 PM saw a right
Whale  the middle and latter part
fine weather and steering S. E. and one
sail in sight so much. When 24 hours
the Wind N. W. Lat 38.35 S Long 18.00 E

Friday Oct 3rd 1845

Begins with fine breezes from W and
steering S. E. with all sail out the
middle & latter part fine weather and
steering S. E. by E and at meridian saw
a right Whale so much. Lat 38.54 S Long 18.30 E

Saturday Oct 4th 1845

Begins with fine breezes from N. W. steering
S. E. by E. the middle and latter part fine
weather and nothing of note so much
when 24 hours Lat 38.54 S Long 19.30 E

Sunday Oct 5th 1845

Begins with light air from W and steering
S. E. by E the middle and latter part
calm and saw nothing. Lat 38.38 S
Long 18.25 East

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Monday October 6th 1845

Begins with light air from S. E. by S and
steering S. E. with all sail set the
middle and latter part a fresh breeze from
S. E. and heading S. and put out the
Starboard Boat and took in the Larboard
one to drink. Lat 39.00 S Long 19.13 E

Tuesday Oct 7th 1845

Begins with strong winds from S and
heading S. E. at 4 P. M. reefed top sails
it blowing strong the middle and latter
part the same and Wind W. and steering
S. E. by S at meridian made sail the weather
clear so much. Lat 38.00 S Long 20.25 W.

Wednesday Oct 8th 1845

Begins with strong gale from N. W.
and steering S. E. at 8 PM the Wind
increased to a gale and put her under
double reef the top sail and and fore sail it
blowing very heavy and a bad sea on
the middle and latter part blowing
very hard the Wind from West and
running under close reef fore and main
top sail and fore sail so much. When
24 hours. Lat 39.48 S Long 23.25 E

Thursday Oct 9th 1845

Begins with heavy gale from W and
steering S. E. under close reef fore
top sail & fore sail and a bad sea
on at 8 PM the Wind abated some
at 8 made sail and at 12 had all sail
set with fine weather the latter part
the same and so much.
Lat 38.45 S Long 27.00 E
