

Ship C. W. Morgan Crossing the Indian Ocean
Saturday Nov 1st 1845
Began with Light breeze from S.W. and
steering E. S. E. with all sail out the
middle and latter light air and saw
nothing of note. Lat 34° 58' Long 93° 00' E

Sunday Nov 2nd 1845
Began with Light air from the Westward
and steering N. E. by E. with all sail set
the middle and latter a Light breeze
from S.W. Lat 34° 07' Long 93° 40' E

Monday Nov 3rd 1845
Began with Light breeze from S.W. and steering
E. S. E. with all sail set the middle and
latter part the same and saw nothing of
note. Lat 34° 04' Long 94° 46' E

Tuesday Nov 4th 1845
Began with fine breeze from S.W. steering
E. S. E. the middle and latter part a fine
breeze and steering E. S. E. and ended the 24
hours. Lat 34° 07' Long 100° 00' E

Wednesday Nov 5th 1845
Began with fine breeze from W. and
steering E. with all sail out the middle thick
weather latter rain, seas and wind from the
South so ended. Lat 36° 15' Long 103° 05' E

Thursday Nov 6th 1845
Began with Light breeze from the S.
steering E. the middle and latter Light
breeze from S.W. to S. W. by E. and ended
impeded a morning a main top-sail and saw nothing
of note. Lat 35° 00' Long 105° 15' E

Ship C. W. Morgan Crossing the Indian Ocean
Friday Nov 7th 1845
Began with Light breeze from the Westward
and steering E. the middle and latter part
fine weather and saw Fin Backs so ended
the 24 hours. Lat 35° 40' Long 107° 05' E

Saturday Nov 8th 1845
Began with Light breeze from the
S.W. and steering E. the middle and
latter part a strong breeze and steering E. and
so ended. Lat 34° 30' Long 110° 00' E

Sunday Nov 9th 1845
Began with strong breeze from S.W. and
steering E. N. E. at 8 it blowing heavy
we kept down the middle and latter part
a heavy sea and steering E. by S. we
saw Black Fish. Lat 33° 45' Long 113° 33' E

Monday Nov 10th 1845
Began with strong gale from W. S. W. and
steering S. E. at 8 P.M. close reef the Fore &
Main Tails at 9 took in Fore sail and
Tails & kept to it blowing heavy Fast and
the S.W. Cape of New Holland 50 miles
dist the latter the same and heading N.
so ended. Lat 34° 35' Long 114° 38' E

Tuesday Nov 11th 1845
Began with strong gales from W. S. W.
and steering to windward close reef the Tails
and Fore sails heading E. the middle more
moderate at 3 it took back sail and kept
of E. S. E. at 8 Made N. Holland bearing E
dist 18 miles and the wind S.W. by S. kept
along the coast. S. E. so ended the
24 hours. Lat 35° 10' Long 116° 30' E
