

Ship of W Morgan on New Holland
Wednesday Nov 12th 1845

Begins with fresh winds from S.W. and
staring by the wind S.W. by S the sails
under his lee and a heavy swell on at
8 A.M. moderate and set out the reefs
& set the top gills the middle and latter
part light air and the land in sight
to the N.E. Lat 35° 35' Long 117° 00' E

Thursday Nov 13th 1845

Begins with light air from the N.E. and
at 1/2 past noon saw black fish landed
& got 8 at 3 got on board at 7 P.M. a strong
breeze and set down the middle main moderate
and standing in for the land at 7 P.M. had a
fine breeze from the N.W. and getting ready to
anchor at 12 set our anchors 40 fathoms
of water in Two Peoples Bay of Holland
to wind - Lat 35° 35' Long 117° 00' E

Two Peoples Bay for Water
Friday Nov 13th 1845

Begins with fine weather and getting ready
to raft to get water at 4 P.M. went in
with it the latter part employed a coopers
bread and filling water barrels with a
breeze in from E.

Saturday Nov 14th 1845

Begins with fresh breeze from E and
swell coming in at 4 P.M. put down
the other anchors and employed a coopers
bread and to part the middle and latter part
thick and employed coopers bread to
to wind -

Sunday Nov 15th 1845

Begins with light air from the Eastward
and biting S fish the latter part fine weather
Wind S.W. and clear -

Ship of W Morgan, in Two Peoples Bay, New Holland
Monday Nov 14th 1845

Begins with fine weather and W.S.W. and
latter part the same and
employed a getting water and cleaning ship
to part -

Tuesday Nov 15th 1845

Begins with light breeze from E and
clear weather and got at 4 P.M. finished
getting of water and blacked the barrel
on one side the latter part a strong
breeze from E and employed painting ship
& mending the top sail to end -

Wednesday Nov 16th 1845

Begins with strong gale from E and painting
ship & mending sails at 5 P.M. the
W held to S.W. the latter part fine and
employed painting and getting ready for sea at
noon all ready to wind -

Thursday Nov 17th 1845

Begins with light air from the S at 11
P.M. took anchors for sea at 5. Glass in to
Wald Island the wind very light & were ship
to the S.W. to get of shore at 9 calm at 10
took a breeze from S.W. and starboard S. the latter
part and squall from S.W. & W to end this
24 hours - Lat 35° 35' Long 119° 30' E

Friday Nov 18th 1845

Begins with strong wind from S.W. starting S.E.
with all sail cut at 5 P.M. took in light
sails and reefed fore & main S. sail the latter part
moderate and all sail set at 11 Wind W. to end
saw nothing of note - Lat 37° 35' S
Long 122° 20' E.
