

Ship to W. Morgan in the S. Pacific Ocean
Tuesday Dec 17th 1845

Began with fresh breeze from the South &
heading to the Eastward at 7 took in sail for
the latter steering to the wind W. & S.
and a fresh breeze Lat 34° 28' Long 183° 30' E

Wednesday Dec 18th 1845

Began with strong wind from S.W. & steering
to N. at 7 P.M. Shortly sail and run under
top sail & fore sail it blowing fresh the middle
& latter part blowing strong and steering to
wind Lat 34° 35' Long 183° 08' E

Thursday Dec 19th 1845

Began with fresh wind from S.W. & steering
to N. & under double reef top sails the middle
& latter moderate and all sail set & in p.m.
saw down squaw Lat 34° 14' Long 181° 00'

Friday Dec 20th 1845

Began with light breeze from S.W. steering
to with all sail cut the middle & latter part
fine weather Lat 34° 25' Long 180° 42' E

Saturday Dec 21st 1845

Began with fine weather and steering S.E. &
the middle and latter part fine and saw
33 fish and fin backs etc. and the latter
24 hours Lat 34° 48' Long 179° 37' E

Sunday Dec 22nd 1845

Began with fine weather wind S.W. and
steering N.E. by E at 8 left the to the
N. at 9 took in sail for the right heading
W. & S. the weather fine and no whales to
day at 5 A.M. saw the Three Kings bearing S.W. by W.
Lat 30 miles and the wind light from the Westward
& heading S.W. by E. Lat 34° 55' Long 178° 27' E.

Ship to W. Morgan in the S. Pacific Ocean
Monday Dec 23rd 1845

Began with light wind from the Westward & at 7
and heading to the South with all sail set the middle
part light and in the latter part strong and
at 11 P.M. spoke ship of S. Bedford 18 miles
out 300 of whale to end. Lat 34° 00' Long 176° 20' E.

Tuesday Dec 24th 1845

Began with strong wind from S.W. and one ship
in sight at 7 P.M. the wind blowing a Gale here to
under top sails heading W. at 8 P.M. took in sail it
was moderate and part 3 sail of ketches so wind the
24 hours Lat 33° 34' Long 174° 56' E

Wednesday Dec 25th 1845

Began with fresh breeze from S.W. and steering to
the North and 2 sail in sight the middle and latter
part fine weather Lat 33° 35' Long 171° 15' E

Thursday Dec 26th 1845

Began with fresh wind from W.S.W. and at 3 P.M.
saw a long back 500 of whale the latter part strong
wind and heading N. so wind the 24 hours
Lat 32° 45' Long 172° 45' E

Friday Dec 27th 1845

Began with fresh breeze from the Westward
at 12 P.M. the wind held from to S and
moderate the latter the same and heading to
S.E. and no whales Lat 32° 25' Long 173° 42' E

Saturday Dec 28th 1845

Began with light breeze from the South and
heading E.S. by E at 6 took in sail the latter fine
and all sail cut West S.W. by S and
saw nothing of Note Lat 33° 34' Long 173° 55' E.
