

Ship to W^m Morgan of New Zealand a Cruising
Wednesday Jan 7th 1848

Begins with a heavy Gale from S.W. and
heading S. by E. and ends our journey at 1 the
gale abated some at 10 P.M. but again fresh
& Foul air & long Boiling the latter more
moderate so ends Lat 33.45 S

Long 172.00 E

Thursday Jan 8th 1848

Begins with fine breeze from S.W. and clear
weather at 3 P.M. saw the three Kings
and were ship of shore the latter part fine
weather and boiling so ends this 24 hours

Lat 33.44 S Long

Friday Jan 9th 1848

Begins with light breeze from the S. and
boiling heading to the Westward the middle
moderate at 8 P.M. finish boiling the
latter part fine Lat 33.39 S Long 172.00 E

Saturday Jan 10th 1848

Begins with light air from the S. heading by
the Wind to the Eastward at 4 P.M. ship to
the Westward the middle and latter part
fine weather & saw nothing of note

Lat 33.54 S Long 170.33 E

Sunday Jan 11th 1848

Begins with light breeze from the S. heading
by the Wind to the South West and all sail but
the middle and latter part the same and working
to windward but this is a more tedious thing
to the West Lat 33.54 S Long 170.50 E

Monday Jan 12th 1848

Begins with light breeze from the South and
beating up to windward but very slow the middle
the same at 4 P.M. sailing wind S.E. latter clear
weather Lat 34.18 S Long 171.17 E

Tuesday Jan 13th 1848

Begins with fine breeze from S.W. heading to
the Eastward at 6 P.M. spoke the Barque
London Packet of 8 Bedford a Breeding and 2
other ships in sight to windward the middle &
latter part fine weather and in company with the
S. Packet so ends Lat 34.22 S Long 171.17 E

Wednesday Jan 14th 1848

Begins with fine weather Wind S.E. and in
company with the London Packet at 9 P.M.
left thus at 5 A.M. saw a hauled going quick
to windward toward but could not catch
them at 9 P.M. on board so ends & sail
in sight Lat Long

Thursday Jan 15th 1848

Begins with light breeze from S.E. and by the
Wind a Cruising the middle and latter part fine
weather and saw nothing of note and light
air from East Lat 34.33 S Long 171.29 E

Friday Jan 16th 1848

Begins with light air from the Eastward
and heading S.E. with all sail set at 7
P.M. saw Black Bird the latter part implied
stowing down our oil so ends this 24 hours
Lat 34.44 S Long 172.20 E

Saturday Jan 17th 1848

Begins with fine breeze from S.W. and heading
to the Eastward & implied stowing down oil
at 8 P.M. finish and were ship of shore
the middle and latter part sailing and one Barque
in sight to leeward and we set fore & main
top sail so ends heading to the South wind
N.W. Lat 34.58 S Long 172.50 E
