

Ship. to W. Morgan on the Coast of New Zealand
Sunday Jan 18th 1848

Begins with strong winds from N.W. and thick weather, heading N.E. at 8 we saw ship at 10 wind held to S.W. and, were ship heading N.W. and the weather being the middle and latter part fine weather and the king in sight so ended — Lat 33.32 Long 17.00

Monday Jan 19th 1848
Begins with fine breezes from S.W. and heading N.W. at 2 P.M. spoke ship James Macrae of New Haven 20 months but 1800 the middle & latter part fine weather Lat 34.00 Long 17.00

Tuesday Jan 20th 1848
Begins with light airs and calms heading to the N.W. and the land in sight at 3 sail at 5 P.M. took in sail for the night the middle and latter fine breezes from N.W. and saw nothing of note but sail Lat 34.08 Long 17.05

Wednesday Jan 21st 1848
Begins with fine breezes from N.W. and heading to the N.E. at 5 P.M. spoke ship Friendship of New Haven 8 months but 1800 and from the N.W. coast at 7 took in sail for the night the middle and latter part showing some from N.E. W. and here to so ended & sail in sight and no whale ... Lat 34.15 Long 17.00

Thursday Jan 22nd 1848
Begins with fresh breezes from N.W. and rain at 3 P.M. wind held to S.W. and fine weather and made sail the middle and latter part a strong breeze and under short sail and one sail in sight Lat 34.50 Long 17.40

New Zealand
Friday Jan 23rd 1848

Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. and heading N.W. at 2 P.M. spoke ship & Main Top Sail & heading N.W. the middle & strong breeze & rain latter part and wind S.W. employed a machine at fore top sail out of a main one to hold the 20 hours. Lat 34.29 Long 17.20

Saturday Jan 24th 1848
Begins with fresh breezes from the South and heading N.W. and at work on a fore top sail at 7 took in sail for the night the middle and latter fine weather and sent a fore top sail and so ended & sail in sight Lat 34.04 Long 17.00

Sunday Jan 25th 1848
Begins with fine weather wind S.E. and the S. River having E. N.E. 10 miles at 5 P.M. ship of short and started sail for the night the middle fine latter calm and sail in sight & so ended — Lat — Long 17.00

Monday Jan 26th 1848
Begins with calm weather at 3 P.M. took in a latter breeze from S.W. at 4 spoke Susan London Packet and a number of ships in sight to the South & Black Fish the latter being and heading the fore top sail so ended & sail in sight & no whale Lat 34.40 Long 17.30

Tuesday Jan 27th 1848
Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. and heading S.E. employed a machine the fore top sail the middle part sent the fore top sail the latter part calm and one ship in sight Lat 34.55 Long 17.38
