Begins with fine weather and wind from S. S. W. and
heaving S. E. the middle part light to
the wind & short sail for the night
the latter part fine weather and saw nothing of
note & heaving S. E. so ends & no account

Sunday Feb 22nd 1845

Begins with fine weather and wind from S. S. W.
& heaving S. E. & all sail set at
10 took in light the middle part fine
at 10 P.M. saw a whale & lowered and
got one so ends

Lat 32° 00' Long 179° 00' E

Monday Feb 23rd 1845

Begins with fine weather and at 5 P.M. took
the whale along side at 8 P.M. took the Marine
Therian of R. Bedford 500 of Whale at 8 P.M.
from the Marine the weather fine & the
Ship in sight so ends at direction got the
Body up

Begins with fine weather at 4 P.M. took
V. Corn Boiling the middle and latter part
fine & heaving & saw nothing of note

Begins with fine weather and the wind W
& employed heaving the middle & latter part
the same Lat 32° 30' Long 179° 00' E

Monday March 2nd 1845

Begins with fine weather and heaving at 8
P.M. took down and Corn breaking out
to throw down so ends three 24 hours
