

East Coast of New Zealand
Monday April 6th 1846

Begins with strong winds from N. and strong
S. winds double reefed sails at 4 P.M. saw squalls
& took in sail the middle of the latter part
fine weather and saw nothing of note

Lat 31° 15' Long 178° 25'

Tuesday April 7th 1846

Begins with fresh breeze from S.W.
and steering E.N.E. at 4 P.M. spoke
Ship Mission of N.Z.B. 2300 all the
middle & latter part strong winds and wind
at 4 P.M. sunset the main sail and
sift it up so well Lat 32° 44' Long 178° 20'

Wednesday April 8th 1846

Begins with strong gale from S.W.
& steering W by N the middle & latter the
same and saw nothing of note

Lat 34° 55' Long 178° 35'

Thursday April 9th 1846

Begins with strong winds from S.W. and
steering S.E. and employed a mendicant sails
& sail braced of the Red Sea but saw
nothing more of them the middle strong winds
at 8 P.M. saw a shoal of whales & at 10 heard



Lat 31° 47' Long 178° 30' E

April 10th 1846

Begins with fine breeze and at 2 P.M. took
the whale along side & at 4 P.M. hauled and
at 8 P.M. for the night at 8 P.M. horn again at
4 P.M. sunset so well Lat 31° 40' Long 178° 50'

Friday April 11th 1846

Begins with fine weather and wind S.W. at 2
P.M. horn boiling the latter part of the same
& saw nothing of note so well

Lat 31° 42' Long 178° 47' E

East Coast of New Zealand

Sunday April 12th 1846

Begins with fine weather wind S.W. and saw a
boiling at 2 P.M. saw a large S. whale and
at 4 P.M. lowered the latter part of the
same side of the boat at 6 P.M. horn boiling
the latter part of the same

Lat 31° 45' Long 178° 40'

Monday April 13th 1846

Begins with fine weather and a boiling
at 5 P.M. sunset and at 7 P.M. boiling
the latter part fine and a boiling so well

Lat 31° 51' Long 178° 50' E

Tuesday April 14th 1846

Begins with fine weather and boiling and
the wind back to the S.W. at 4 P.M. horn
whale at 9 P.M. lowered the latter part of the
same side of the boat at 10 P.M. horn
boiling and boiling a
plenty of work Lat 31° 59' Long 178° 50'

Wednesday April 15th 1846

Begins with fine weather wind S. and employed
at work on the sail and boiling at 7 P.M.
cold down at 5 P.M. sunset the middle
fine so well Lat 31° 59' Long 178° 50'

Thursday April 16th 1846

Begins with fine weather and at 2
P.M. horn boiling the latter part fine and
and employed about the the sail & so well
the 23 heard Lat 31° 59' Long 178° 50'

Friday April 17th 1846

Begins with fine weather and a boiling & so
forth at 9 P.M. cold down the works at 5
P.M. horn boiling down so well the weather fine
and saw nothing Lat 32° 07' Long 178° 22' E
