

East Coast of New Zealand.

Saturday April 18th 1846

Begins with fine weather and steering down the middle and latter part the same and saw nothing of note Lat 32° 08' Long 178° 20'

Sunday April 19th 1846

Begins with fine weather and steering down at 8 P.M. finished the fine the middle & latter part fine weather and saw a ship to windward Lat 32° 08' Long 178° 58'

Monday April 20th 1846

Begins with fine weather wind S. and steady at 8 P.M. saw a shoal of 4 whales several and got more & pursued them at 10 P.M. came on board the middle part fine weather at 11 P.M. saw whales and at 12 noon got past the S. so much

Begins with fine weather and at one o'clock P.M. took one whale along side at 8 took the other one at 5 P.M. some better so much Lat 32° 22' Long 179° 00'

Wednesday April 22nd 1846

Begins with fine weather and better at 8 P.M. finished all but one had to go long boiling at 9 A.M. saw a shoal of whales close to the ship but did not want them at 8 took the other 4 and so much with as much as we can do Lat Long

Thursday April 23rd 1846

Begins with thick weather wind S.W. and we a boiling as fast as we can the middle part the same at 8 P.M. spoke the Canton Packet of 8. supposed to have cut 40 lbs so much then 24 hours

Friday April 24th 1846

Begins with fine weather and boiling & heading to the Westward the middle & latter part fine weather and heading to the Eastward & boiling so much then 24 hours Lat 32° 30' S Long 179° 28'

Saturday April 25th 1846

Begins with strong wind from the North and steering heading to the Eastward & employed a boiling & so forth at 8 P.M. took down the work and the weather thick and a strong breeze so much Lat 32° 35' S Long 179° 15'

Sunday April 26th 1846

Begins with strong wind from the North heading E.N.E. and at 8 P.M. spoke at 8 P.M. took them in the middle part thick and latter the same & heading to the Eastward so much then 24 hours Lat Long

Monday April 27th 1846

Begins with thick weather wind S. the middle part rainy and heading E.N.E. the middle & latter a calm from the North so much then 24 hours Lat 33° 25' Long 178° 40' E

Tuesday April 28th 1846

Begins with heavy calm from the North and rain the middle the wind held to N.W. and then 24 hours Lat 33° 25' Long 178° 40' E

Wednesday April 29th 1846

Begins with strong wind from N.W. & heading S. where that sail the middle and latter part moderate and employed a cleaning but between 8 P.M. so much Lat Long
