

C. W. Morgan of S. C. of Evan

Friday June 5th 1846

Begins with strong winds from E and heading
S. by S. under double reef at 5 P.M. shorted
sail for the night the middle and latter
part the same Lat Long

Saturday June 6th 1846

Begins with strong winds and squalls
and heading E. S. E. wind S. E. the
latter part the same Lat Long

Sunday June 7th 1846

Begins with strong winds from N. E.
and heading E. S. E. & employed Mending
sails & so forth latter part more moderate
and all sail set Lat 14.00 Long 172.20

Monday June 8th 1846

Begins with fresh winds from N. E. and
squalls of rain the middle the same latter
part the wind from N. E. rain. Lat 24.00 Long 172.00

Tuesday June 9th 1846

Begins with light air from the S. E. squalls
staring N. at 5 P.M. double reef the top sails
the middle and latter part fine trades from
S. E. & steering N. Lat 22.00 Long 172.20

Wednesday June 10th 1846

Begins with fine weather and trades
from S. E. steering N. and variously employ
the latter part the same at 20.00 Long 172.00

Thursday June 11th 1846

Begins with light trades from S. E. and
steering N. E. & employed at work on the
rigging the middle & latter part fine and
saw nothing Lat 19.22 Long 171.59

Friday June 12th 1846

Begins with fine trades from S. E. and steering
by the wind N. E. the middle part the
same and saw nothing of note

Lat 18.02 Long 171.20

To day we got in to a sand mist and sailed in it &
had it being very thick & hid the rigging & sail hall
& the ship looks a hough to be a phantom any more

C. W. Morgan Bound of the Navigator Islands

Saturday June 13th 1846

Begins with light trades from S. N. E.
& heading to the North at 4 A.M. the
ship got in to a sand mist and we sailed
through it 9 hours it being very thick

Lat 19.22 S. Long 171.20

Sunday June 14th 1846

Begins with light air from W. N. W. and
heading to the S. E. the latter part wind from
S. E. steering N. E. the latter part rain and
a fresh breeze & under short sail Lat

Long

Monday June 15th 1846

Begins with heavy rain and the wind
S. E. & heading to the S. E. the latter part
the same Lat Long

Tuesday June 16th 1846

Begins with moderate breeze from S. E. &
and clearing the middle and latter part
a fresh breeze and clear at 10 A.M. made
the Navigator Islands baria N. E. 8.25.00
to end Lat 24.50 S. Long 169.18

Wednesday June 17th 1846

Begins with strong breezes from S. E. &
and heading to the N. E. the latter part fine weather
and steering W. E. towards in sight of the
Le Boer Islands Lat 14.06 Long 170.33

Thursday June 18th 1846

Begins with light breezes from S. E. &
steering W. N. W. at 4 P.M. the same &
mild dist and we left to of shore at 5
hook in sail for the night the latter part
breeze Lat Long

Friday June 19th 1846

Begins with fine weather and the islands in
sight the middle and latter part squally and saw
nothing of note Lat Long
