Begins with fine weather and a waiting
for. Men and to day got one the Middle and
Latter part fine and all ready for sea & the
Plot on board

Friday July 10th 1846
Begins with fine weather and the Middle
& Latter part fine weather and all ready for
sea the Middle & Latter part the same

Saturday July 11th 1846
Begins with fine weather at 1 P.M. took
our anchors for sea at 3 got anchors stowed
and steering N.W. by W. with a fine breeze
the Middle and Latter part fine & steering W.S.W.
and Long being east. Lat 13° 31' S Long 178° 55' W

Sunday July 12th 1846
Begins with fine breeze from the Eastward
& steering W. S. W. under all sail the Middle
& Latter part Moderate breeze and steering W. S. W.
to wind. Lat 13° 39' S Long 179° 42' W

Monday July 13th 1846
Begins with light breeze from E and steering
W. S. W. at 8 P.M. saw Wallis Island bar
N.W. by W. and took in top-gallant sail & left
to the North at 5 A.M. left of for the Land
saw a large whale in the ship's wake and
lowered but he was galled at 9 came off
board and put off for the Land at 10 saw a
school of whales lowerd got 3 and at 11 took them
down side. Lat 13° 16' S Long 179° 00' W

Tuesday July 14th 1846
Begins with thick weather and close in to
the Land and steering southerly
to Leeward at 4 P.M. but one whale in and
at 11 left to Leeward
of the same at 5 P.M. but in the thick and
so ended - Lat 13° 00' S Long 179° 11' W

Off Wallis Island & Round West
Wednesday July 15th 1846

Begins with fine weather and boiling and the
Land in sight the Middle & Latter part the
same Lat 13° 22' S Long 179° 10' W

Thursday July 16th 1846
Begins with fine weather and boiling at 8.
P.M. finish and the Latter part the Land
to windward and boiling up to it
Lat 13° 00' S Long 179° 10' W

Friday July 17th 1846
Begins with light breeze from the S. and stand
ing in for the Land the Middle and Latter part
fine and steering in for the Land so well
that 24 hours. Lat 13° 25' S Long 178° 25' W

Saturday July 18th 1846
Begins with fine weather and Leeward a
boat and went in to get some rain at 3 P.M.
came off and only got one and left of W. S.
W. with all sail but the Latter part a fine
breeze and pleasant weather Lat 13° 05' S Long 178° 05' W

Sunday July 19th 1846
Begins with strong wind from S. E. and
steering W. S. W. at 4 P.M. left to the S. at 5
having strong and raining & put under double
reef top-sails & were ship to the S. E.
the Middle heavy rain and squalls & under short
sail the Latter part made sail at 11 A.M. saw
Horn Island barise S. E. C. Lat 13° 49' S Long 178° 10' W

Monday July 20th 1846
Begins with fresh breeze from S. E. and
to Leeward of the Land at 5 P.M. left
of S. W. and a fine breeze the Middle heavy rain
and a strong breeze Latter part the same
to wind Lat 14° 19' S Long 179° 47' W

Tuesday July 21th 1846
Begins with strong wind from S. E. and steering
W. S. W. under short sail at 5 P.M. saw whales lowerd
but rugged and came on board & took in sail the Middle
and Latter part strong winds Lat 15° 59' S Long 180° 30' W
