

Hague Islands

Wednesday July 22nd 1846

Begins with strong breezes from S.E. and heading S.P.W. at 5 P.M. Made one of the Hague Islands Barine S.P.W. at 8 saw a Sail in shore at 7 was ship of the Middle heavy rains and finally latter stud in for the Land and saw a Bark to anchor and a ship out side a Crusard so end Lat Long

Thursday July 23rd 1846

Begins with rainy weather and wind of the Land & working of Shore one ship in sight the Middle fine latter employed a Steering down but did so end this day Lat Long

Friday July 24th 1846

Begins with fine weather at 4 P.M. finished Steering down the Middle and latter a strong breeze and clear weather and saw two ships to Windward so end Lat Long

Saturday July 25th 1846

Begins with strong trades and heading close in with the Land the Middle strong breeze and of the Island of Sur at 4 P.M. saw a Large whale going quick to windward lowered but could get up with him so end

Sunday July 26th 1846

Begins with fine weather at 3 P.M. saw a school of whales going quick to windward lowered but could not get up with them and came on board the latter part strong wind and heading of the Island of Sur

Monday July 27th 1846

Begins with strong breezes and in to the Land of Sur at 4 P.M. spoke the Alfred of S. Bedford a boating & had no talk of it the Middle fine at 8 P.M. saw a Large whale going to windward at the rate of 8 Knots lowered but could not get up with him Lat 15 55 Long 179 40

Hague Islands

Tuesday July 28th 1846

Begins with fine weather one of the Island of Sur and the Schooner & this in sight the Middle and latter part fine weather and saw nothing of note Lat Long

Wednesday July 29th 1846

Begins with fine weather and light air from S.E. the Middle and latter the same and in company with the Sanger and Alfred so end this day Lat Long

Thursday July 30th 1846

Begins with light air and heading in for the Island the Middle and latter part Moderate and close in to the Island so end this 24 hours with no whales Lat Long

Friday July 31st 1846

Begins with fine weather and of the Island of Sur the Middle and latter part the same and saw nothing of note the Middle and latter steering to the Westward alone the Sanger at direction of Round Island so end this 24 hours Lat Long

Saturday August 1st 1846

Begins with light breezes & pleasant weather and steering to the Westward the Middle & latter part Moderate and saw two Hump Backs and thought they were of whales I lowered at 12 came on board so end this 24 hours

Sunday August 2nd 1846

Begins with moderate breezes the Middle and latter part the same and down of Low Island so end this 24 hours

Monday August 3rd 1846

Begins with light air and down of Low Island at 2 P.M. I lowered came of the Middle and latter part fine weather and employed spending the Night up Sail so end this 24 hours saw nothing of note Lat Long
