Thursday Sept 17th 1845

Begins with fine weather and boating at 2 1/2. At 4 M. Finisht boating and soon hauls a Green boat so ends their 24 hours

Friday Sept 18th 1845

Begins with fine weather and close in to the land the Middle and latter part rainy so ends their 24 hours

Saturday Sept 19th 1845

Begins with equally weather and close in to the land the Middle and latter part. Strong wind and ends their sail so ends 24 hours

Sunday Sept 20th 1845

Begins with strong winds and squally weather and of see a passing porpoise the Middle and latter part the same and saw nothing

Monday Sept 21st 1845

Begins with fresh breeze and employed in showing down the latter part the same

Tuesday Sept 22nd 1845

Begins with strong breeze and at 3 P.M. Finisht showing down the Middle and latter part strong winds so ends and a schooner in sight

Wednesday Sept 23rd 1845

Begins with strong winds and in our bay at 10 P.M. spoke the schooner Alfred of 18. 500. she had got 100 since we saw her last the Middle and latter part strong winds

Thursday Sept 24th 1845

Begins with strong winds and under the lee of our the Middle and latter part the same and saw nothing of note

Friday Sept 25th 1845

Begins with strong winds and to seaward of our the Middle and latter part a gait of wind and have to so ends their 24 hours

From the Iceberg Islands to Kautassak

Saturday Sept 25th 1845

Begins with strong gale from E.S.E. and fine the Middle and latter part moderate and made sail at 8 P.M. saw the schooner so ends in company

Sunday Sept 26th 1845

Begins with strong winds and running in to our bay in P.M. with the Alfred at 2 the latter part on board at 9 P.M. we left her and steering N. by E. with a strong breeze from E. S. E. the latter part a gale and have to

Monday Sept 28th 1845

Begins with a gale from E. S. E. rain the Middle and latter part the same and lying to making 85

Tuesday Sept 29th 1845

Begins with strong winds and strong wind E. S. E. making 18. latter part more moderate and steering N. S. W. and all sail set

Wednesday Sept 30th 1845

Begins with light winds and steering N. S. W. Middle part left to for the night at 7 P.M. saw the Island of Kautassak and steering for it W. so ends

Thursday Sept 1st 1846

Begins with fine weather at 5 P.M. got her enough to sweep the soft sea water the latter part a breeze

Friday Oct 2nd 1846

Begins with fine weather the Middle and latter part moderate winds and so ends their 24 hours

Saturday Sept 3rd 1846

Begins with fine weather and got the raft of walrus and 2 bat loads of wood so ends their 24 hours

Sunday Sept 4th 1846

Begins with light airs and calm and 2 boats on shore after securing the Middle and latter part fine weather
