 Begins with fine weather and a breeze over the ground at 8 A.M. saw 14 whales 1000 and 1000 but could not get on at 11 took up the boat and with no fish

Monday June 16th
 Begins with fine weather and no whales the latter part wind from the North so ends

Tuesday June 17th
 Begins with a fresh breeze from the Westward the latter part saw well Island in sight so ends

Wednesday June 18th
 Begins with fine weather and nothing to be seen the latter part the same and saw nothing

Thursday June 19th
 Begins with fine weather and nothing to be seen the latter part the same Lat 10.44 S Long 178.30 E

Friday June 20th
 Begins with fine weather and a breeze over the ground and no whales Lat 10.58 S Long 178.40

Saturday June 21st
 Begins with fine weather wind from S.E. and steering N. with all sail set the land bearing S. the latter part land out of sight

Sunday June 22nd
 Begins with fine weather and steering N. 8.30 the latter part the same Lat 12.53 S Long 179.50 E

Monday June 23rd
 Begins with fine weather at 8 A.M. struck the Island of Palabuk and steering for the same

Tuesday June 24th
 Begins with fine weather and heading in for the land at 8 P.M. came to anchor in 12 fath water latter part Squally

Wednesday June 25th
 Begins with fine weather and a falling water the latter part got of a raft so ends

Thursday June 26th
 Begins fine and getting of water and latter part one watch on Liberty

Friday June 25th
 Begins fine and one watch on Liberty the latter a getting of water and painting ship

Saturday June 26th
 Begins with fine weather and one watch on shore and the latter a getting of wood and so forth

Sunday June 27th
 Begins with fine weather and one watch on shore and so forth

Monday June 28th
 Begins with fine weather the latter part three tracks and getting ready for sea

Tuesday June 29th
 Begins with three tracks and clear weather and a painting ship and so forth

Wednesday June 30th
 Begins with three tracks and clear weather and heading up Lick for sea and ship side of New Bedford Spring of and on with 1100 at 8 A.M. took our anchors for sea with a strong breeze from S.E. at 11. set the anchor stood

Thursday July 1st 1844
 Begins with three tracks at 10 A.M. went the Island heading N. at 8 P.M. out of sight latter part fine breeze and more of Island sail set so ends Lat 14.44 S Long 179.

Friday July 2nd
 Begins with three tracks and heading N. the latter part wind from E. and fair weather and nothing in sight Lat 16.50 S Long 178.40 E

Saturday July 3rd
 Begins with three tracks & heading S. S. E. the middle part saw Russell Island latter part heading in for Low Island & two barks in sight at 11 A.M. landed & put up two barks of oil that caused

Sunday July 4th
 Begins with fine weather latter part got 24 barks of oil from Low Island so ends ship the Russell got the ship to arrive
