Thursday September 1st

This day begins with calm in the first part at 5:30 A.M. raised a whale we layed four boats the ^{small} struck but we not saw whale the whale took mates line and we chase the mate but no chance at 4 P.M. mate cut from whale ship under double reef top sail and blowing from W. and very rugged

Lat. 38-40 Long. 45-14

Friday Sept. 2^d

Strong breeze from W. and rugged B.K. under close reef topsails and courses saw few B.K. and jampus and the saw two merchant men heading to N.W. and we signalled one English

Saturday Sept. 3^d

This day begins with fresh breeze from W. and very heavy swell from N. and Barque Cruising in the latter part more moderate saw one steamer steering to S.E. Lat. 38-46 North

Sunday Sept. 4th

This day begins with strong breeze from S. and rugged we steered W.N.W. and one vessel in sight at N. we came to and commenced to take in sails at 7 P.M. saw a large sperm whale but commenced to blow and blow gale from S.E. and took in all sails and lay to and could not lower

Monday Sept. 5th

Strong gale from N.W. and Barque heading to N.E. all day with close reef main top sail at sundown wore ship and head to W.N.W. and set fore top sail

Tuesday Sept. 6th

Light breeze from N. in the first part of the day middle part fresh breeze from S.E. but in the latter part squally & thunder and lightning and raining took light sails and double reef fore top sail

Wednesday Sept. 7th

This day begins with light breeze from N. and N.W. middle part cloudy but in latter fine weather and pleasant & wing from N. at sundown took in light sails and lower one boat for Can Boy with 6 farthams of chases Lat. 39-01 Long. 46-37

Thursday Sept. 8th

This day begins with calm in the first part of the day middle and latter part light breeze from E. to S. and rain squalls this steered N. at sundown took in fore top gallant sail

Friday Sept. 9th

Fresh breeze from W. in the morning and Barque steering N. at 7:30 A.M. the wind hauled to N. and rainy weather we took in some sail and heading by the wind saw two vessels heading to E.

Saturday Sept. 10th

Fresh breeze from N.E. and quiet pleasant all day saw two vessels heading to east ward at sundown took in all sails

Sunday Sept. 11th

Fresh breeze from N.E. in the first part of the day middle and latter part squally and rain wind S.E.
