Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan

Friday Sept. 23rd

Fresh breeze from N.N.W. and squally in the first part in the latter part more moderate. Saw one sail and we steered S.E. most of the day at Sun down come to on the Port tack.

Lat. 39-44 North

Saturday Sept. 24th

Light breeze from W.N.W. in the first part of the day middle part breeze from W.S.W. at 11. we tack and head to N.E. with light breeze and heavy swell from N.E. at 3 P.M. raised whales we lowered four boats waist Bowt Struck. And took him long side at 7 P.M.

Lat. 39-46 Long. 41-50

Sunday Sept. 25th

Light breeze from W. in the first part of the day. hook on and commenced to cut our whale in the latter part the same but we did not get true cutting on account of chane Broken neck off at Sand down and put chane on the head.

Monday Sept. 26th

Light breeze from E. and ship heading to north and we got true cutting and commenced to Boil we partled full

Tuesday Sept. 27th

Light breeze from N. in the first part in the latter part the same we boiling at 10 P.M. heavy squalls from W. and rainy took in all sails

Wednesday Sept. 28th

Strong breeze from W. and squally the Barque under close reef main top sail and fore stay sail and are still Boiling

Thursday Sept. 29th

Light breeze from E. in the first part of the day middle and latter part Calm and we are still Boiling and got true at 5 P.M. and our whale tunk. up about 138 Barrels two vessels in sight and a lar Bay.

Friday Sept. 30th

Strong breeze from N.N.W. and squally weather the Barque lying under close reef main top sail but we slowed down oil in the latter part moderate wind hauled to E.N.E.

Saturday Oct. 1st

Light breeze from N.E. in the first part of the day in the latter part wind from N.N.E. and very cloudy we got Stowing Saw one vessel heading to N.E.

Sunday Oct. 2nd

Fine breeze from W. in the first part of the day and Barque Steering N. with small sails at 6 A.M. made Sail and the wind hauled to W.N.W. in the latter part the same Saw two vessels north and men

Monday Oct. 3rd

Strong breeze from N.E. and rugged in the first part of the day in the latter part moderate and Barque under close reef top sails and fore sail jib and spanker Saw one vessel head to Eastward
