

Remarks on Board Bark C. W. Morgan

Saturday Oct. 15<sup>th</sup>

Fine breeze from N.W. at day light and smooth at 7 A.M. commencing to rain at 8 A.M. heavy squall from North and then commencing to blow and become gale we steered E.S.E. and then S.E. with close reef top sails in first part but in the latter part a gale from N. at 3.45 P.M. Saw whales & large whales but we could not lower blowed so hard we come to heading E. whales heading to N. to windward

Lat. 38-30 Long. 75-00

Sunday Oct. 16<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breeze from N.W. in the first part of the day we made sail heading to westward in the latter part moderate wind hauled to N.N.W. we took ship and head to N.E.

Lat. 38-21 Long. 77-57

Monday Oct. 17<sup>th</sup>

Strong gale from W. and heavy rain squall at 7 A.M. wind hauled to N.N.W. and blowed very strong all day and we steered E. by S. with close reef main top sail and fore sail two vessels in sight

our Lat. 39-15 North

Tuesday Oct. 18<sup>th</sup>

Strong gale from N.N.W. and rugged we steered E.S.E. all day under close reef main top sail only and Ball works stowed

Wednesday Oct. 19<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze N.N.W. and heavy squall from N. we steered E. by S. in the latter part wind from W. and heavy weather

Thursday Oct. 20<sup>th</sup>

Heavy gale from N.W. in first part we run E. by S. with close reefed maintop sail in latter part wind hauled to N.N.W. we come to took in all sails

Friday Oct. 21<sup>st</sup>

Gale from N.N.W. and heavy squalls and set close reefed main top sail and steered E.S.E. in the first part of the day in the latter part the same at 3 P.M. Raised the Island Corvo and Flores at 7 P.M. Flores about two miles to eastward to day Lat. 39-57

Saturday Oct. 22<sup>d</sup>

Strong breeze from N.N.W. and rainy in the first part of the day the Island in sight in the latter part light breeze and heavy swell we steered S.E. at 3 P.M. Same Fayal at Sun down came to on the western tack

Sunday Oct. 23<sup>d</sup>

Moderate gale from S.W. all this day at 5 P.M. moderate and clear up no land in sight Lyi to with main lower top sail only

Monday Oct. 24<sup>th</sup>

This day commences with calm and heavy swell from S.W. middle part light breeze from S.E. and foggy with rain at 5 P.M. heavy squall from N. we took in all sails and took the things out of the boats the Island are not in sight we suppose Is land to be about 50 miles off Bearing S.S.E. by compass
