Saturday Feb. 25th

one vessel in sight

This day begins with light breeze from S. and rainy in the first part of the day Barque steering by the wind heading about S. by E. middle and latter part clear wind hauled to S.E. one vessel in sight

Lat. 41-30 Long. 64-03 E.

Sunday Feb. 26th

The first part of this day calm middle and latter part light air from N.N.W. Barque steering S.E. by S. saw two vessels and we have heavy swell from S.W. and the weather became very cloudy

Monday Feb. 27th

This day commences with light breeze from N.E. and cloudy Barque steering S.E. by E. middle and latter part the same the Barque under all sails steered S.E. and the weather grew clear

Tuesday Feb. 28th

Fresh breeze from N.W. and foggy in the first part Barque steering S.E. by E. or S.E. by S. with main top gallant sail out in the latter part the same all the crew employed in braking out and change water

Lat. 40-45 Long. 70-11 E.

Wednesday March 1st

This day commences with light breeze from W. and foggy Barque steering S.E. by E. with all sails out saw one ship heading to eastward middle part clear but latter part thick fog and fresh breeze from S. the Barque steering by the wind heading about S. E. E.

Fresh breeze from S. to S.W. in the first part of the day Barque steering S.E. by E. with all sails out in the latter part strong breeze from S. took in light sails and double reef fore top sail

Friday March 3^d

Light breeze from S.S.W. in the first of the day Barque steering S.E. by E. with all sails out middle part calm in the latter part fresh breeze from N.N.E. and cloudy the Barque steering the same

Lat. 39-51 S. Long. 78-11 E.

Saturday March 4th

Strong breeze from N.N.W. and cloudy in the first part middle part foggy but in the latter part clear up wind hauled N.W. the Barque steering S.E. by E.

Lat. 40-00 S. Long. 82-23 E.

Sunday March 5th

Fresh breeze from N.W. in the first part of the day Barque steering S.E. by E. middle and latter part wind hauled N.W. the Barque steered S.E. and the weather became specially took in same sails

Lat. 40-46 Long. 85-14 E.

Monday March 6th

Light breeze from W. in the first part the Barque steering S.E. by E. and weather very cloudy middle and latter part clear the Barque steered S.E. by E. and wind hauled to N.W. saw several school black fish and drove them in Braces

Lat. Long. 88-08 E.
