 wind North Lat. 40-03 Long. 1-30-08

Fresh breeze from N. W. and cloudy wea-
 ther the Barque steering E. by S. with
 all sails out at 9 A. M. a dark Squall
 took in light sails middle and latter
 part quiet clear and wind from N.

 Lat. 41-52 Long. 1-35-34 E.

Thursday March 23^d

Strong breeze from E. and rugged in the
 first part of the day Barque steering
 by the wind with double reefed fore
 top sail middle and latter part the
 same but the wind hauled more to the
 North and Barque heading about E. by
 S. under small sails

Lat. 42-31 S.

Friday March 24th

This day commences with calm thunder
 and lightning with thick and gloomy wea-
 ther middle and latter part strong breeze
 and Squally Barque steering E. by S. to
 E. at 2 P. M. steered E. to S. under whole
 main top sail and close reefed fore
 top sail Lat. 43-35 S. Long. 1-38-13 E.

Strong breeze from S. W. in the first
 part of the day Barque steering E. by S.
 middle and latter part wind light and
 quiet rugged but clear steered E. by S.
 Lat. 43-31 Long. 1-42-22 E.

 ther in the first part middle part the same
 but in the latter part quiet clear the
 Barque steered from E. S. E. to E. at 4 P. M.
 we stood to be about 60 miles from Cape
