

Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan

Monday March 27th

Fresh breeze from N.W. in the first part of the day the Barque steered N.E. by N. the weather very cloudy middle and latter part clear and quiet pleasant made all sails at Sun down took in some of the light sails

Lat. 44-07 N Long. 1-48-56 E.

Tuesday March 28th

Light breeze from S.E. and rainy in the first part of the day Barque steering N.E. by N. middle and latter part fresh breeze from N. and Barque were round and head to E. and double reefed fore top sails the crew employed in Braking out water

Wednesday March 29th

Strong breeze from N.N.E. and squally weather in the first of the day with thunder and lightning the Barque heading to Eastward under small sails middle and latter part calm saw one ship heading westward

Lat. 43-29 N Long. 1-49-29 E.

Thursday March 30th

This day begins with strong breeze from N.W. and squally weather and then became gale from W. at 3.30 A.M. came to look in all sails lying to until M. and then made little sail and steered N. by E. with main lower top sail and fore sail

Friday March 31st

Fresh breeze from N.N.W. and cloudy weather in the first of the day middle and latter part the same the Barque steering by the wind heading about N.E. to N.W. at sundown became squally

Saturday April 1st

Light breeze from N. to N.E. all this day and pleasant the Barque steering by the wind with all sails out but fore top gallant sail we are getting ready fore dield to boat

Sunday April 2^d

This day commences with calm and then light airs from N.W. in the first of the day in the latter part light breeze from S.S.W. and Barque steered N. by E. the weather is very Pleasant Lat. 40-49 N Long. 157-00

Monday April 3^d

This day commences with moderate breeze from S. and Barque steering N. by E. in the first part but in the latter part strong breeze from S.E. and Barque steering the same Lat. 39-01 S.

Tuesday April 4th

Strong breeze from E. to E.S.E. all this day Barque steering N. by E. under close reefed top sails and courses the weather very squally at 5.30 P.M. we took in courses and furlled them still steering the same

Lat. 36-37 South

Wednesday April 5th

Strong breeze from E.S.E. and squally weather in the first of the day the Barque steering N. by E. in the latter part steered N.E. and wind hauling to N.E.

Lat. 34-06

Thursday April 6th

Light wind and moderate in the first of the day middle part rain storm and squally wind variable in the latter part to be calm the under reef top sails full weather
