Remarks on Board Barge C. W. Morgan

Tuesday April 18th

Strong breeze from N.E. and squally weather in the first part of the day Barge steering E.S.E. by times middle and latter part moderate ship under small sail at sundown took in all but close reef top sails wind about N.

Lat. 34-27 Long. 174-19 E.

Wednesday April 19th

Strong breeze from S.W. in the first part and squally weather Barge steering N.E. by E. middle part steered N. and N. by W. Saw two vessels heading to westward

Thursday April 20th

Strong breeze from S. and rugged all this day Barge steered N. by E. with main top sail and fore sail

Friday April 21st

Fresh breeze from S. in the first part middle and latter part moderate Barge steered N.E. by E. at about 5 P.M. wind hauled to S.E. at sundown took in all sails but close reefed Lat. 30-28 Long. 176-22 E.

Saturday April 22nd

Light wind from Eastward and cloudy weather all this day and Barge cruising

Sunday April 23rd

Fresh breeze from S.E. in the first Barge heading to S.E. we were ship and head to N.E. in the latter part more moderate at 1 P.M. saw whales lower three boats struck and one

Monday April 24th

Light breeze from S.E. and pleasant weather in our whale in the latter part the wind hauled to S.W. and still fine weather we commenced to Boil at about 5:30 P.M.

Tuesday April 25th

Fresh breeze and squally in the first part in the latter part light breeze and pleasant Barge heading to east at sundown became calm

Wednesday April 26th

This day commenced with calm in the first part of the day we are bailing middle and latter part the same at 4:30 P.M. raised whales over lower three Boats but he came night go chance welcome Board and we got bailing crew

Lat. 30-37 Long. 174-37 E.

Thursday April 27th

Fresh breeze from N.E. in the first part of the day Barge heading to N.E. middle part squally in the latter part quiet moderate we slow down some of the oil

Friday April 28th

Strong breeze from N. and squally in the first of the day we slow down part of the oil middle and latter part the same wind strong Barge head to the west and then we wore round and head to eastward at 5 P.M. took in fore top sail and lay to
