Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan

Wednesday May 24th

Moderate Gale from E. in the first part of the day in the latter part wind hauled to S.E. and still blowing Barque lying to with main lower part sail at 4 P.M. became rainy Lat. 33-25-S.

Thursday May 25th

Strong breeze from S.E. all this day and Barque heading to N.E. under closed reef top sails the crew employed in washing ship

Friday May 26th

Strong breeze from S.E. and heavy sea well Barque heading to N.E. in the first part saw one vessel at M. wore ship and head to S. and we made some sails weather more moderate and quiet clear wind hauling to eastward

Lat. 32-41-S. Long. 172-32-E.

Saturday May 27th

Fresh breeze from E. S.E. in the first part of the day Barque made all sails and altered S.E. by S. at 6.45 A.M. raised larvel Cape and altered long middle and latter part light breeze so we could not come in to the harbor at Sandown. Tack ship and head to the North Cape Bare W. 15 miles we held up one chase and bent one anchor

Sunday May 28th

Moderate breeze from N. in the first part of the day we lay off at 1 A.M. and altered S.E. for the Bay and came to anchor at 8.30 A.M. with rain storm in the latter part fine weather but cloudy

Monday May 29th

Go to anchor at Mangonui getting ready for water and this day we have very fine weather wash ship and so on

Tuesday May 30th

Go to anchor at Mangonui this day we have very fine weather and got off raft water and some wood at hands employed at work

Wednesday May 31st

Go to anchor at Mangonui with very fine weather to day we run out salt water to show fresh water and we still working

Thursday June 1st

This we have a fine weather stowed water and got some wood the steamer came in and went out again

Friday June 2nd

Go to anchor at Mangonui getting wood and water and this day we have very cloudy weather and rainy Braking out Shooks for water

Saturday June 3rd

Fresh breeze from N.W. and rainy most all this day we got one boat load of wood Board and could not do any more

Sunday June 4th

This day commences with heavy squalls from N.W. and rainy weather the Barque to anchor at Mangonui in the latter part fine weather

Monday June 5th

Fresh breeze and cloudy weather all this day but we got off raft water and stow them down and set up some Shooks for more water
