Strong breeze from W.S.W. all this day Barque steered E. in the first part in the latter part steered E.S.E. at 4 P.M. came to by the wind heading about S. at Sundown took in sails

Strong breeze from S.W. and Squally weather in the first part but in the latter part moderate and clear saw white water we run for it but we found out to be feet back

Saturday July 15th

Pleasant weather and fine breeze from S.W. all this day Barque steered N.E. in first part but in the latter part steered S.E. to E.S.E. with all sails out at Sundown took in sails

Sunday July 16th

Strong breeze from S.W. in the first part of the day Barque steered E.S.E. and wind hauled to S. we steered E. N.E. in the latter part more moderate

Monday July 17th

Light breeze from S.W. in the first part middle and latter part calm with heavy swell Barque under all sails at Sundown took in spits light air from N.E.

Tuesday July 18th

Strong breeze from N. and Squally weather in the first part Barque heading to westward under small sails in the latter part wind hauled to N.W. but still blowing from N.W. we wore ship and head to N. with lower top sails

Wednesday July 19th

Fresh breeze from S.W. in the first of the day in the latter part moderate and clear Barque steering by the wind heading about W.N.W. took in sails at Sundown

Thursday July 20th

This day commences with light breeze from S.W. and heavy swell from N. in the first of the day in the latter part fine breeze and pleasant Barque headed to W.N.W. at Sundown took in and close reef topsails

Friday July 21st

Calm all this day and heavy swell running we are repairing foot ropes

Saturday July 22^d

Light breeze from S.E. in the first part and cloudy weather middle and latter part rainy weather at 4 P.M. commenced to blow at 6 P.M. heavy squally weather we wore ship and head to N.E. and the wind hauling to N.N.W. rain very heavy took in all sails but lower main top sail and eye to
