Thursday Oct. 19th

This day begins with Gale of wind from N.W. and rainy in the latter part wind hauled to W. and W.S.W. and still blowing the Barque lying to under lower main top sail

gale from N.W.

Friday Oct. 20th

Strong gale from S.E.W. and heavy swell Bark lying to with main lower top sail in the first part but in the latter part more moderate the wind hauled to W. at sundown we were round and head S.E.W.

Saturday Oct. 21st

Strong breeze from W.N.W. and foggy the Bark heading to N. we were ship and head to South under close reefed top sail

Sunday Oct. 22^d

This day begins with strong breeze from W.N.W. and smoochy weather in the latter part commence to blow and rain we took in all sails and lay to

Monday Oct. 23^d

Strong gale of wind from N.W. and very rugged the Barque lying to under Bare Poole no sails in the latter part wind about W. but squally

Heavy gale from N.W.

Tuesday Oct. 24th

Strong breeze from S.W. in the first part of the day in the latter part more moderate and wind hauled to N.W. and be come squally

Wednesday Oct. 25th

Gale from N.N.W. and rainy weather in the first of the day in the latter part wind hauled to S.W. and still blowing Barque lying to with lower main top sail

Thursday Oct. 26th

Gale of wind from S.W. all this day the Barque heading to N.W. under lower main top sail

gale from S.W.

Friday Oct. 27th

This day begins with light breeze and moderate the Barque heading to N.W. at 7 A.M. were round and head to S. and S.E. & wind hauled to W.S.W. Barque with main top gallant sail out Lat. 36-52 South

Saturday Oct. 28th

This day begins with light breeze from N.W. and fine rain and wind hauled to N. and N.E. Barque altered W.S.W. with main top gallant sail out at sundown took in sail and left main top sail out

Sunday Oct. 29th

Light breeze from S. in the first part of the day at 6 A.M. saw Wright whales we lower four Boats but no chance there we alter being squally in the latter part wind hauled round to S.E. we lower again but squalls came heavy we had to come Board and leave whales Lat. 37-29 Long. 170-45 W.

Monday Oct. 30th

Strong breeze from S. all this day and rugged Barque cruising under short sails saw white water but weather being so rugged did not find them out

Strong southerly wind

Tuesday Oct. 31st

Heavy gale from S.W. all this day and Barque lying to all day with out sail heading to the N.W.
