Light breeze from S. in the first part of the day we got true boiling and took in Stowen Boat for repairs in the latter part light air from S.S.W. all most Calm but the weather is very cloudy

Light and variable wind all this day we got true Stowing down and finish repairing the Starboard Boat the weather has been very cloudy today and look like rain

This day begins with rain and light breeze from S.E. we Launch out mate Boat and commence to wash the ship we rose whales first two going to windward very fast and then saw two more we lower but no chance in the latter part fine weather wind S.W. and clear Whales raised by Enos. Boatstern and Cooper

to S.W.

This day commences with light breeze S.S.E. and light rain middle and latter part fresh breeze from S.S.E. and wind haul to E.S.E. the Barque Steered S.S.W. with all sails out

Friday Nov. 17thScraping

This day begins with light breeze from S.E. the Barque Steering S.S.W. middle and latter part the same but the wind quiet variable and clear weather saw number seen Backs and we commence to scrape our Barn

This day begins with calm in the first part of the day at 9.30 A.M. we raised School Black fish we lower four Boats and got five black fish in the latter part the same weather very pleasant and clear

Monday Nov. 20thwash

Light breeze and calm in the first part of the day Barque Steering about S. saw number seen Backs the crew are employed in washing Barn in the latter part fine breeze from N.W. and pleasant the Barque Steered S.W. E. with all sails out

Tuesday Nov. 21stBound
to S.W.

This day begins with light breeze from W. and very smooth the Barque Steering S.W. E. we hauled out our Black fish and Bounded our Bone Black fish made 6. lbs and Bone 18 Hundred Pound we wash ship and commence to paint in the latter part the same saw Party seen Back

Wednesday Nov. 22ndGained
Calafonia

Light breeze from N.W. and smooth in the first part of the day the Barque steering S.W. E. and we are still painting ship in the latter part quiet breeze from N.W. at 2 P.M. saw ship at harbor and we gained her Calafonia of New Bedford Lat. 42-58 South
