Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan

Friday March 9th

East wind
Strong easterly wind and rugged the Barque steered N.W. with whole main in top sail and courses jib and spanker in the latter part the same
Lat. 37-42 South

Saturday March 10th

Strong breeze from E.N.E. and squally the Barque steering about N.W. in the first part in the latter part the same and wind hauled to N.E. Barke heading about N.W. by N.
Lat 35-30

Sunday March 11th

Strong breeze from N.E. and rugged in the first part middle part rain storm in the latter part thick fog and fine rain wind from N. at 7 P.M. wore ship and head to E.N.E. under lower top sail

Monday March 12th

Light breeze from W. and squally in the first part of the day middle and latter part fine breeze and pleasant - we steered N.N.E. at sundown took in light sails

Tuesday March 13th

Painted Boats
got true paint
This day begins with fine breeze from S.E.W. and Barque steering N.N.E. in the first part of the day we finish painting boats in the latter part commence to rain and become squally and thick weather

Wednesday March 14th

Strong breeze from E. and rugged in the first of the day in the latter more moderate the Barque steering by the wind heading about N.N.E. Lat. 31-31

Thursday March 15th

Sailed Palatka
Strong breeze from E.N.E. and rugged in the first part of this day in the latter part moderate and Barque heading to the North we wore ship and head to E.E. at sun down took in and close reefed top sails

Friday March 16th

Saw French Rock
Strong breeze from N.E. and thick cloudy weather in the first part middle and latter part more clear we saw the Rock and we white water but we made it out to be a Rock Lat. 31-11

Saturday March 17th

Strong breeze from N.E. and rainy all this day the Barque under short sails heading to the N.N.W.

Sunday March 18th

This day begins with strong breeze and rainy weather in the first of the day middle and latter part the same the wind from E. and blowing strong at 6:30 P.M. took in fore top sail wore ship and head to S.E.

Monday March 19th

Gale from E.
This day commences with heavy gale from E. and squally the Barque lying to with lower main topsail only in the first part of the day in the latter part the wind hauling to the S.E. and the weather more moderate

Tuesday March 20th

dark & gloomy weather
Very strong breeze from S.E. and hauling to S. and S. by W. saw Brig steering to N. the heavy weather and squally all this day and tristing with very heavy swell from E. at sun down took in and smoo up the things
