Remarks on Board Barge C. W. Morgan of

Saturday April 14th

Light breeze from N.W. and squally weather with Thunder and Lightning in the first part of the day middle and latter part quiet clear and fine breeze from N.W. at sun down rain

Sunday April 15th

Strong breeze from N.W. and squally in the first part of the day middle & latter part tempest Thunder & lightning the lying to under lower main topsail

Monday April 16th

All this day has been squally Thunder and Lightning and variable wind from all parts and under small sails

Tuesday April 17th

Strong breeze from W. in the first part of the day in the latter part no moderate we steered E. with main top gallant sail out at 3.30 P.M. saw whales lower four boats but no chance the whales going quick to leeward

Wednesday April 18th

Fresh breeze from S. and heavy swell from the same quarter in the latter calm at sun down light breeze

Thursday April 19th

Fresh breeze from E. in the first part of this day in the latter part quiet smooth and cloudy weather

Friday April 20th

Light breeze from E. and cloudy weather in the first of the day in the latter part rainy and squally the wind still E.

Saturday April 21st

Strong Easly wind all this day and rugged the Barge under small sail heading to the South in the first part at 6 P.M. wore ship and head to N.W. took boats on the upper beam

Sunday April 22nd

Strong breeze from E. and rugged all this day the Barge heading to the N. all day under lower top sails fore sail and main stay sail

Monday April 23rd

Strong breeze from S.E. and cloudy weather in the first part of the day in the latter part rainy and wind will be come light and hauled to North

Tuesday April 24th

Light breeze from S. and pleasant all day we abseil and our men employed in tarring rigging at sun down took in sail and heading to E.S.E.

Wednesday April 25th

Fine breeze from S.W. and pleasant all this day the Barge under all sails heading to S.E.

Thursday April 26th

Fine breeze from S. in the first part and smooth in the latter part the same the wind hauled to eastward we saw the Island

Friday April 27th

Light breeze from E. in the first of the day and wind hauling to N.E. in the latter part fresh breeze and cloudy one steamer in sight and two sailing vessels spoke more than
