Sunday April 29th
 This day commences with Calm in the first part of the day middle part at 4 P.M. we come light breeze from N.E. saw a deceiver and gamel Robert Morrison and Gibbs

Monday April 30th
 Light breeze from N.E. in the first part and Rainy two vessels in sight middle part quiet moderate but in the latter part Squall and wind from S.W. hauling to westward at Sundown fine weather one vessel in sight

Tuesday May 1st
 Fine breeze from W. all day and pleasant the Bark under full sails in company with Gibbs

Wednesday May 2^d
 Light breeze from S. all this day and Barque heading to eastward took Bone on deck and Mark it and put them down again saw Sandy Island and three other small ones

Thursday May 3^d
 Fresh breeze from S.W. and smooth all this day Goat Island quiet handy Gibbs still in sight and saw another vessel we spoke to Robert Morrison we are still Tanning

New Bedford C. F. Keith Master on whaling voyage

Friday May 4th
 This day begins with calm and cloudy weather in the first part middle and latter part Rainy at 3 P.M. Spring up little breeze from S.E. we steered N.W. to get clear from land Adline Gibbs in sight and R. Morrison at Sundown the come Rain Storm

Saturday May 5th
 This day begins with heavy squalls from N.E. and Rainy and wind hauling to S. and Blown hard the Barque took in all sails but lower main top sail

Sunday May 6th
 Strong breeze from S. and Rugged in the first part of the day in the latter part wind hauled to S.W. and moderated at Sundown Barque heading S.S.E.

Monday May 7th
 This day begins with heavy squalls and wind hauling from S. to S.W. and back again to South the Barque under short sail saw one vessel

Tuesday May 8th
 Moderate gale from S. and hauling to S.S.E. in the latter part clear and quiet Rugged the Barque under lower top sails

Wednesday May 9th
 Strong breeze from S. and some squall in the first part of the day in the latter part moderate and heavy swell on the Barque covering whole main top sail and closed reefed fore top sail.
