

## Remarks on Board Barge C. W. Morgan

Monday June 4<sup>th</sup>

This commences with blow from E. and heavy rain storm with thunder and lightning and wind hauling to S.E. and then back to E. and S.E. in the latter part quiet clear we have steered from S. to W.S.W. and then come to by the wind in company with Gibbs

Tuesday June 5<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with light breeze from N.E. and light rain two vessels in sight at 9 a.m. we saw land and we steered S.W. and then S. and S.E. in the latter part rain heavy we steered in fore land got in and came to anchor at 4.30 P.M. with two others ships wind hauled to E. so we could not get in to inner harbor at Mongonui New Zealand and and Captain went on shore

Wednesday June 6<sup>th</sup>

This day begins with light breeze from E. and rainy the Barge to anchor in the outer harbor at M. we got under way and made sail and towed with three boats and came to anchor in to inner harbor with fine weather come to at 3 P.M. in company with Gibbs

Thursday June 7<sup>th</sup>

To anchor at Mongonui this day begin to get wood and got anchor stoke and scrub ship

Friday June 8<sup>th</sup>

To anchor at Mongonui getting wood. This day we have very fine weather and smooth

Come to anchor in outer harbor at 4.30 P.M.

Saturday June 9<sup>th</sup>

The first part of this day smooth weather and fine rain we still wooding and got off three casks of water to anchor at Mongonui making anchor stoke

Sunday June 10<sup>th</sup>

The first part of this day light breeze from W. middle part squally we drag out our anchor we run lines and change ground at dusk became moderate

Monday June 11<sup>th</sup>

To anchor at Mongonui this day we had very squally weather and we moved ground and put out our anchor

Tuesday June 12<sup>th</sup>

All this day very fine weather we still wooding the Captain and his wife ashore

Wednesday June 13<sup>th</sup>

To anchor at Mongonui still wooding and nothing more going on only blowing quiet hard from S.W.

Thursday June 14<sup>th</sup>

To anchor in Mongonui this day we sent home our Borne in the Steamer Willmeton

Friday June 15<sup>th</sup>

This day we commenced to stow the half whole for Fresh water and got on board the Runway man Marcelino

Saturday June 16<sup>th</sup>

About this time we have a very fine weather and dry we are breaking out getting ready for water and getting on our wood and sitting up stoves

at Mongonui
